The Hokies will round out a three-game, season-opening stretch at home this week as High Point comes to town for Tech's first mid-week game of the season and later William & Mary arrives on Saturday. Tech put a commanding start to the 2012 season when it claimed a dominant 21-4 win over Presbyterian last weekend at Thompson Field.

### Series Info: High Point

Tech and the Panthers met for the first time in 2011 as the Hokies topped High Point in its first ever game at the varsity level. Tech claimed a big 18-13 win in the game that opened the 2011 season for both teams. Tech moved to 23-6 all-time against teams currently in the National Lacrosse Conference after topping PC last weekend.

### Scouting Report: High Point

High Point enters the game at 1-0 on the season after sneaking past Navy at home last weekend, 11-10. Christie Dougherty led the way with three goals, while Chelsea Thompson added two of her own and assisted three more. Anna Wallingford got the start in goal and allowed seven goals in 27 minutes of action. She was relieved by Julia Burns, who made five saves and allowed three scores in 33 minutes.

### Series Info: William & Mary

Tech is 1-4 all-time against the Tribe, claiming its only victory at home in 2008. The Hokies fell for the third-straight year, this time on the road in 2011 as then-No. 16 William & Mary claimed a 21-8 victory in Williamsburg, Va. Tech is 14-32 all-time against teams in the CAA.

### Scouting Report: William & Mary

William & Mary enters the weekend game at 0-3 on the season but has had a week and a half of rest before arriving in Blacksburg. The Tribe has seen some early challenges, facing then-No. 5 Duke in its home opener and day later heading to then- No. 2 Maryland. William & Mary most recently fell at Navy, 13-12, in a mid-week game.

Taelor Salmon leads the team with seven goals on the season, while Maggie Anderson has also tallied seven points, byway of five goals and two assists. Lucy Ferguson has minded the goal for the Tribe, making 31 saves so far this season.

## Player Spotlight

### Ryan Rotanz • Sr. • Attack • Salem, Va.

In the big season-opening win over Presbyterian College last weekend, Ryan Rotanz got out to a hot start in 2012. Rotanz paced the squad with six points in the game after scoring three goals and assisting three more all in the first half. The Hokies cruised to victory after reaching the ten-goal differential by the midway point of the first half. They also hit the halftime break with a 17-1 advantage.

#### Keep it Rolling

The Hokies are coming off their most successful season since 1999. Tech's 10-8 record in 2011 was its winningest in over 10 years and marked the first winning season since 2000.

After starting the season 4-0, the Hokies tacked on a close, one-goal game against nationally ranked James Madison, a last-second win at Lehigh and their second-ever ACC victory when they topped then-No. 16 Boston College 12-11 at home.

Tech will look to build off this success and string together another impressive season in 2012.

#### Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 will be seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

#### Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Senior Jessica Nonn entered the season as the team's most experienced player. The three-year starter has not missed a single game or start in her career, and is the only current player on the squad to rank among the all-time bests in Tech history.

The middle broke in the the all-time career points list in the season opener as her five points in the game brought her to 130 for her career, good for 10th place. Nonn entered the season already ranking in the top 10 in goals, draw controls, caused turnovers and ground balls.

#### Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale has returned as the starter in the cage for the Hokies in 2012. This will be her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native finished last season with a 9-7 record and made 115 saves, good for a .387 save percentage. Gale spent time over the summer trying out for the US national team and will look to use that experience to help her be a leader and involve herself more with the defensive unit.

Arguably her best performance last season was when the Hokies topped then-No. 16 Boston College 12-11 at home during the regular season. She assisted her team in earning just its second ever ACC victory, while also making a then-season best 12 saves. She also denied all eight Boston College free position attempts in the game. Gale earned Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week honors for her performance.

#### Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up

since arriving at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field. The Catonsville, Md., native finished her junior season with 31 goals, 36 points, 19 draws, 29 ground balls and 17 caused turnovers.

#### Heaps Helps out on Offense

Junior Julia Heaps rose to the occasion last season in her first year as a full-time starter. Heaps totaled 20 goals and 16 assists on the offensive end, good for 36 total points, while also winning 18 draw controls in her second season. The Street, Md., native provides great options on offense for the Hokies as she excels at attacking the goal and can dominate the set-up game from behind the cage as well.

#### Defensive Debuts

The Tech defense has a much different look in 2012. In the season opener against PC, Taylor Landry made her collegiate debut after missing last season due to injury. Also making her first career start was junior Charlotte Marsh.

#### Back Where They Belong

In the season opener against Presbyterian College, juniors Brooke Martin and Libby Rosebro both transitioned back to their original position and showed great glimpses of success to come. Rosebro contributed greatly on defense last season but has rejoined the midfield this year due to her offensive success in the off-season. In the opener she assisted two goals and

scored one of her own. Martin rejoins the attack this season from the midfield last year. In her 2012 debut she put away two scores and assisted another. Both players started the PC game.

### Fresh Start

All eight of the team's freshmen saw action in the season-opening win over Presbyterian College, while newcomer Megan Will also started the game. Will led all newcomers with three points in the game as she buried the first three goals of her career. Also earning their first points were Jack Boissonneault (2g), Maddy Hess (1g, 1a), Rachel Skay (1g), Cawley Bromley (1a) and Meg Bartley (1a).

### Changing Things Around

Tech will see a number of players switch positions this season or return to positions they previously played. Junior Libby Rosebro spent much of last season on the defensive end but will return to the midfield this year after emerging as an offensive threat in the offseason. Senior leader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the defensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where she gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last season and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving out of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed last season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middle, but really excelled on the defensive end.

### New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewell, Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada.
