After a week off, the Hokies return to action this weekend as they travel to Old Dominion. This is the third straight weekend the Hokies have been on the road, and the first time this season they have not played a midweek game. Tech is coming off of a key win at Mt. St. Mary's over the weekend that ended a two game skid and got the squad back to its winning ways.

Series Info: Old Dominion

The Hokies are 3-2 against Old Dominion after grabbing a dominant, 18-10, win from the Lady Monarchs at home in 2011.

The two teams first met in 1996, Tech's second season at the varsity level, and the Hokies have recently been on a roll against the CAA foe, topping ODU in each of the most recent meetings, after dropping the first two in the mid 90's.

Tech is 14-32 all-time against teams in the CAA. The Hokies will search for their first CAA victory this season as they are 0-2 thus far, falling to William & Mary and at No. 13 James Madison.

Scouting Report: Old Dominion

The Lady Monarchs enter the weekend at 3-5 on the season. They are coming off a midweek road win, as they defeated Longwood 21-6 Wednesday. Leading the offense for Old Dominion has been Lisa Bernardini who leads the team with 17 goals and five assists. Not far behind is Rebecca Hatrum, with 15 goals and four assists.

Spearheading the defensive efforts for the Lady Monarchs has been goalie Sarah Geary. Geary paces the squad with 19 ground balls and seven caused turnovers. She also boasts a 3-4 record on the year, having allowed 82 goals but has made 58 saves, good for a .414 save percentage.

Player Spotlight

Brooke Martin • So. • Attack • Hunt Valley, Md.

Junior Brooke Martin has been a steady provider for the Hokies this season. She has played in all nine games so far this season, making seven starts. Martin has come on strong in the last five games, scoring in each outing. She kicked off the streak with three goals against UC Davis.

Prior to her scoring spree she had only scored in one game, but made a major impact in the game. Martin set a team season high when she put away six goals in the second game of the season against High Point.

Tech Against The Best

As a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies have the opportunity to face numerous ranked teams every season. In non-conference play, Tech has already taken on then-No. 13 James Madison this season.

The Hokies faced back-to-back ranked opponents last week when they traveled to No. 18 Boston College and later returned home to host No. 4 Duke.

Tech is 4-67 all-time against ranked teams, with its last win coming against then No. 16 Boston College last season.

Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 are seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

High Power Offense

The ACC is home to four of the top 10 teams in the nation in total offense, based on total points scored. The Hokies round out this group, holding the No. 9 spot with 158 points.

Also ranking in the top 10 and representing the ACC are Duke in third with 214 points, North Carolina in fourth

with 211 points and Maryland at No. 6 with 175 points.

Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Already a dominant player on the field, senior Jessica Nonn has extended her takeover this season to Tech's record books. While the Catonsville, Md., leads the team with 19 goals, nine assists, 28 points and 37 draws, she also ranks among the all-time best at Tech in even more categories.

Nonn holds the No. 2 spot in caused turnovers and a third-place ranking in ground balls, draw controls and goals. She also sits at fifth in points.

The senior is the only player to have scored in all nine games season, while she also ranks second in the ACC with a 4.11 draw control per game average.

Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale remains as the starter in the cage for the Hokies, which makes it her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native has made 38 saves so far this season, good for a .306 percentage. Despite the loss, Gale came up big against William & Mary, blocking all four free position attempts in the game. Most recently, Gale allowed just one goal in the first half at Mt. St. Mary's.

Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up since arriving

at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field.

The Catonsville, Md., native is tied for second in the conference as she averages 1.44 caused turnovers per game. Widlake also paces the team with 13 caused turnovers, ranks second with 13 ground balls and is third with 12 goals.

Future Production

Freshmen Megan Will, Jack Boissonneault and Meg Bartley have come on strong early in their collegiate careers. The trio of newcomers have combined to score 37 goals, assist ten more and scoop up 24 ground balls through seven games.

Will has missed just two starts in her career and is tied for team lead with 19 goals this season. Boissonneault is tied for second on the squad with 13 ground balls and is a perfect 5-for-5 on free position attempts. Bartley recently ended a three game scoring streak, only to begin a two-game assist streak.

Back Where They Belong

Juniors Brooke Martin and Libby Rosebro have both transitioned back to their original positions this season and have proven they are happy to be back. Rosebro contributed greatly on defense last season but has rejoined the midfield this year due to her offensive success in the off-season. The Richmond, Va., native has tallied seven points, ten ground balls and five caused turnovers on the year. Martin rejoins the attack this season from the

midfield last year. Through nine games, she has tallied 15 goals and 18 points, including an impressive six-goal outing against High Point.

Protecting the Cage

The Tech defense has a much different look in 2012. Senior captain Julie Wolfinger spearheads the newly constructed unit and she is joined by junior Charlotte Marsh, redshirt freshman Taylor Landry and redshirt junior Chirstina Patten, who both missed last season due to injury. Relieving the starting crew has been freshman Ann Wallace Tazewell.

Nine games into the season, the unit has hit its stride, tallying 23 ground balls and 18 caused turnovers collectively.

Heaps Helps out on Offense

Junior Julia Heaps got out to a slow start in 2012 but has still remained a staple in the Hokie attack. After not earning a point in the season opener, Heaps scored two goals against High Point. The Street, Md., native tacked on her third point of the season with an assist against William & Mary.

Fresh Start

All eight of the team's freshmen saw action in the season-opening win over Presbyterian College, while newcomer Megan Will also started the game. Will led all newcomers with three points in the game as she buried the first three goals of her career. Also earning their first points were Jack Boissonneault (2g), Maddy Hess (1g, 1a), Rachel Skay (1g), Cawley Bromley (1a) and Meg Bartley (1a).

Changing Things Around

Tech will see a number of players switch positions this season or return to positions they previously played. Junior Libby Rosebro spent much of last season on the defensive end but will return to the midfield this year after emerging as an offensive threat in the offseason. Senior leader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the defensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where she gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last season and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving out of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed last season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middle, but really excelled on the defensive end.

New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewell, Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada.
