Scouting UC Davis

UC Davis enters the week at 1-4 on the season falling to Cal, 18-12, over the weekend. The Aggies break up conference play hosting Virginia Tech, and are riding a three-game losing streak into the Tuesday game.

Elizabeth Datino leads the team with 15 goals and 10 assists on the year. Kai Murphy has manned the cage for the Aggies and boasts the team's record, making 39 saves so far this season, good for a .371 save percentage.

Scouting California

Cal enters the week at 2-2 on the season after topping conference foe UC Davis, 18-12 a week prior. The Bears will host Iona in a midweek game before welcoming the Hokies to Berkley, which will cap off a four-game home stand for the Bears.

Megan Takacs and Gabby Christman are leading the Bears with 10 goals apiece. Though she has yet to score a goal, Lizz Lavie paces the team with seven assists so far.

Megan McGinnis has been in cage for Cal and has made 34 saves on the season, good for a .479 save percentage.

Last Time Out

The Hokies returned to conference play last weekend, but fell to No. 20 Boston College 15-7. Despite being down 10-1 at the half, the Hokies cleaned things up in the second half, committing just one turnover and putting points on the board. Seniors Libby Rosebro and Brooke Martin lead the team with three points each as Rosebro put away two goals and assisted another, and Martin assisted a pair of scores and buried one of her own.

Tech went on a three-goal run midway through the half, which included both of Rosebro's scores, and tacked two more on in the closing minutes, but the difference was too much to overcome.

Veteran Experience

Tech returned a wealth of experience this season as it welcomes back 12 seniors. As a class, these veterans have been an integral part of the transition the program has recently made. They have helped lead their squad to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in over 10 years. They have also assisted in taking down ranked conference opponents in back-to-back years, topping then-No. 16 Boston College in 2011 and then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Against The Best

The Hokies have a chance to play numerous ranked opponents and NCAA Tournament participants every season, especially within conference play. This year Tech opened with No. 7/6 Duke on the road and hosted No. 20 Boston College last weekend. Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in the last two seasons, earning their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia last year.

Record Watch

Senior Alex Gale is the only current player on Tech's roster to rank amongst the all-time best in career stats, as she sits in fifth place at Tech with 325 career saves.

Sophomore Meg Bartley and senior Julia Heaps are both on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as Bartley has won 71 draw controls to date and Heaps has 23 career assists. Bartley needs to win 12 draws, while Heaps needs 12 assists.

Strong Conference

The Atlantic Coast Conference has made a name for itself as a strong lacrosse conference. This season, five teams entered the year ranking in the top 20 of both the IWLCA Poll and the deBeer Media Poll. Maryland and North Carolina currently hold the No. 1 and 3 spots in both polls, while Duke and Virginia help round out the top 11 in each.

Will to be the Best

Sophomore Megan Will has scored in five of the team's seven games so far this season, putting away at least two goals in each of those outings. She leads the team in scoring with 14 goals so far this year, including a four-goal performance at Davidson. The Bel Air, Md., native is currently 13th in the ACC averaging 2.57 points per game.

Gale in Goal

Senior goalie Alex Gale has been the primary starter in cage since her arrival in 2010. Her 325 career saves lands her in fifth place all-time Tech. The Cicero, N.Y., native's 12 saves at Duke to begin the season stands as the second-best single-game high throughout the ACC this season.

Gale is currently ranking fourth in the league with 5.43 saves per game.

Right Back to Business

Senior Brooke Martin returns great experience to the Hokie attack and midfield this year. She has played in every game since arriving on campus four years ago and is the only player on the team that has scored in every game this season. The Hunt Valley, Md., native ranks second on the team with 13 goals this year.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Sophomore Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and currently ranks third in the league, averaging 4.00 draws per game. She has also scored a goal in each of the last five games.

True Team Player

Senior Libby Rosebro has been a team-first player for the Hokies over the years. She has started and played in every game since the beginning of her sophomore outing. The middle made the transition to defense as sophomore to add game-experience but is currently surging on the offensive end. The Richmond, Va., native had scored at least one goal in the last six games and had an assist in the last five. She posted a career-best five points against James Madison and ranks second on the team with 14 points.

Back in Action

After missing much of last season due to injury, Julia Heaps has

returned not only to the field but to her old ways. The Street, Md., native had her coming out at Davidson this season after a 2-goal, 3-assist performance against the Wildcats.

Fresh Meat

Freshman Jessi Thon earned a starting spot to begin her collegiate career and has made an impact for the Hokies early. She is currently tied for fourth amongst league players, averaging 2.00 ground balls per game.

Joining her in the starting line up has been classmate Meghan Macera, who is second on the team, winning 19 draws so far this year.

Controlling the Draw

The Hokies as a team have dominated the draw this season, winning 89 so far, while their opponent has only won 69. Tech ranks fifth in the conference averaging 12.71 draw controls per game.

Progressing Program

The Virginia Tech lacrosse team has seen a steady momentum shift over the past few seasons. Since former assistant Megan Burkner took over as head coach the Hokies have put together back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in program history while also knocking off ranked conference opponenets in back-to-back years. Tech earned its best ACC finish in 2011 when a tiebreak awarded the Hokies the three-seed in the annual ACC Tournament. Tech also set a new program best in 2012 when it finished the year with a 7-2 record at Thompson Field.

Senior Leaders

Captaining the Hokies this season will be seniors Libby Rosebro, Brooke Martin, Julia Heaps and Christina Patten. All four bring a wealth of on-field experience. Entering the season they have combined to play in 190 games and make 137 start, even with Heaps being sidelined for much of last season due to injury and Patten suffering a torn Achilles causing

her to miss 2011.

Welcome Aboard

Tech welcomes eight freshmen to the squad this season, hailing from six different states. Hannah Sieger is the only goalie in the new mix for the Hokies and she joins the team from San Diego and Rancho Bernardo High School. Laney Clarke (Virginia Beach, Va./ Cape Henry) and Mikayla Sweeney (Waxhaw, N.C./ Waxhaw) will look to add depth for the Hokies on attack.

The remaining newcomers will contribute in the coming years from the midfield or on the defensive side of things. Gracee Hendrix (Vero Beach, Fla./ Vero Beach), Claiborne Lucas (Roanoke, Va./ Patrick Henry), Jessi Thon (Victor, N.Y./ Victor), Kelsey Allen (West Islip, N.Y./ West Islip) and Meghan Macera (Westminster, Md./ Westminster) will look to earn playing time in their debuts.
