All Time vs.Boston College: 4-9 · At VT: 3-3 · At BC: 1-5 · Neutral: 0-1 Notes: Boston College holds the series advantage as the two teams have only ever met as conference foes (BIG EAST, ACC) ... BC claimed the meeting earlier this season, 15-7, in Blacksburg ... The Eagles and Hokies have only met once in the post season - 2011 ACC Tournament - and BC took the 17-3 win after Tech won the regular season meeting, 12-11 ... Tech is 1-0 against the Eagles in overtime ... BC has been ranked in each of the last four meetings.

Scouting Boston College

Boston College wrapped up the regular season with an 11-6 record and finished third in the ACC with a 3-2 record. The Eagles are currently riding a seven-game winning streak into the post season that began at the end of March with back-to-back conference wins over Virginia and Duke. Boston College has yet to drop a contest in the month of April.

Leading the Eagles offense is Covie Stanwick, who paces the team with 52 goals and 22 assists. Stanwick ranks among the top players in the nation in both points and scoring. She is currently second in the conference, averaging 3.06 goals and 4.35 points per game.

Mikaela Rix is second on the team in scoring with 43 goals, while her 61 draws this year have helped Boston College rank second in the league, winning 13.71 draws per game. Kate McCarthy has helped lead the Eagles' defensive unit grabbing 29 ground balls and causing 22 turnovers.

In goal for Boston College will be Emily Mata, who boasts the team's record as well as a .344 save percentage.

Hokie Notes

- -- The Hokies are in search of their first post season win since joining the ACC for the 2005 season. Tech hasn't claimed a conference tournament victory since winning the Atlantic 10 Tournament in 1999.
- -- In each of the past two seasons, Tech has knocked off a ranked conference opponent (2011 No. 16 BC, 2012 No. 7 UVa), and will look to keep that streak alive against the Eagles.
- -- The Hokies have two players that lead the league in their respective categories as sophomore Meg Bartley wins 4.53 draws per game and redshirt senior Christina Patten causes 1.40 turnovers per game.
- -- Until the Virginia game, senior Brooke Martin was the only Hokie to score in every game this season. She has scored in 14 of the team's 15 outings.
- -- Sophomore Megan Will has tallied four or more points in eight games this season, including two six-goal performances.
- -- The game against Boston College marks the 16th game of the season for the Hokies, this is the fewest number of games Tech has played since playing 15 games in 2005, the first year the program joined the ACC.

Running with the Best

Tech ranks among the best in the league as it sits at third in the ACC averaging 4.60 assists and 15.07 ground balls per game.

Two Hokies lead the league in their respective categories as Meg Bartley averages 4.53 draws per game and Christina Patten causes 1.40 turnovers per game. Bartley is the only Hokie to rank nationally as her draws average ties her for 14th in the country.

Veteran Experience

Tech returns a wealth of experience this season as it has 11 seniors and a redshirt junior on its roster. As a class, these veterans have been an integral part of the transition the program has recently made. They have helped lead their squad to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in over 10 years. They have also assisted in taking down ranked conference opponents in back-to-back years, topping then-No. 16 Boston College in 2011 and then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a number of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Tech began the year at No. 7/6 Duke and later hosted No. 20 Boston College and No. 3/3 North Carolina. The Hokies recently wrapped up the regular season traveling to No. 16 Virginia and later hosting No. 1 Maryland in the final week. To start the ACC Tournament, Tech is matched up with No. 20 Boston College.

Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in the last two seasons, and earned their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia last year.

Record Watch

Senior Alex Gale is one of just two current players on Tech's roster to rank amongst the all-time best in career stats, as she sits in fifth place at Tech with 370 career saves.

Sophomore Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, and is in sixth place with 111 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking second with 68 so far this year.

Redshirt junior Julia Heaps is on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as she has 30 career assists, needing just five more, while senior Brooke Martin needs just five goals to join the single-season scoring list and redshirt senior Christina Patten needs to cause just two turnovers to join the single-season ranks.

Sophomore Megan Will's 41 goals so far has already landed her at seventh on Tech's single-season list.

Will to be the Best

Sophomore Megan Will has scored in 12 of the team's 15 games this season, pposting four or more points in eight of those outings. She leads the team in scoring with 41 goals this year, including a pair of six-goal performances, at UC Davis and against Longwood. Will was named VT Hardee's Star of the Week after scoring six goals at UC Davis and following it up putting away three goals at California. She later set a new career best when she added two asssits to her second six-goal performance of the year for an eight-point total against Longwood.

The Bel Air, Md., native is currently tied for fifth in the ACC averaging 2.73 goals per game and ranks sixth with 3.47 points per game.

Gale in Goal

Senior goalie Alex Gale has been the primary starter in cage since her arrival in 2010. Her 370 career saves lands her in fifth place all-time Tech. The Cicero, N.Y., native has notched a pair of 12-save games this season, at No. 7 Duke and against No. 3 North Carolina.

Right Back to Business

Senior Brooke Martin returns great experience to the Hokie attack and midfield this year. She has played in every game since arriving on campus four years ago and has scored in 14 of the team's 15 games this year. The Hunt Valley, Md., native ranks second on the team with 32 goals this year and eighth in the league, averaging 2.13 goals per game.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Sophomore Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and currently leads the league while also ranking 12th in the nation, averaging 4.92 draws per game.

True Team Player

Senior Libby Rosebro has been a team-first player for the Hokies over the years. She has started and played in every game since the beginning of her sophomore outing. The middie made the transition to defense as sophomore to add game-experience but has returned to the midfield and is surging on the offensive end. The Richmond, Va., native had scored in 11 of the last 14 games. She posted a career-best five points against James Madison and ranks

second on the team with 36 points.

Back in Action

After missing much of last season due to injury, Julia Heaps has returned not only to the field but to her old ways. The Street, Md., native had her coming out at Davidson this season after a 2-goal, 3-assist performance against the Wildcats.

Fresh Meat

Freshman Jessi Thon earend a starting spot to begin her collegiate career and has made an impact for the Hokies. She is currently tied for fifth amongst league players, averaging 1.53 ground balls per game.

Joining her in the starting line up for much of the year has been classmate Meghan Macera, who ranks eighth in the league, winning 2.14 draws per game.

Determined Defense

The Tech defense has been a strong force this season. Anchored by redshirt senior Christina Patten, seniors Charlotte Marsh and Kristin Semones and sophomore Ann Wallace Tazewell as well as senior goalie Alex Gale make up the threatening unit. Patten leads the conference with 1.40 caused turnovers per game and was named Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week after causing four turnovers against Longwood and adding an assist.

As a group, they have been a key piece in holding ten of Tech's 13 opponents this year to single-digit scoring, while combining to grab 91 ground balls and cause 55 turnovers.

Big off the Bench

Junior attacker Kelly Naslonski earned the first start of her career against North Carolina and did not disappoint. Naslonski has given Tech great production off the bench this season, with two 4-point performances. Against No. 3 North Carolina the East Setauket, N.Y., native scored two goals and assisted another.

Progressing Program

The Virginia Tech lacrosse team has seen a steady momentum shift over the past few seasons. Since former assistant Megan Burker took over as head coach the Hokies have put together back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in program history, while also knocking off ranked conference opponenets in back-to-back years. Tech earned its best ACC finish in 2011 when a tiebreak awarded the Hokies the three-seed in the annual ACC Tournament. Tech also set a new program best in 2012 when it finished the year with a 7-2 record at Thompson Field.
