

All Time vs. James Madison: 0-11 · At VT: 0-4 · At JMU: 0-6 · Neutral: 0-1 Notes: Tech and the Dukes have met in each of the last ten seasons, but the Hokies have been unable to overcome James Madison ... Despite the losses, there has been a total of six goals that have decided the last three meetings between the nearby schools ... The Hokies fell to JMU at home last season after going into the half tied at six, the Dukes decided the 9-8 game with 1:33 left to play.

Scouting James Madison

The Dukes will open their season hosting the Hokies on Saturday. They finished last year with an 11-6 record. James Madison was picked to finish second the Colonial Athletic Conference and saw four players named to the preseason All-Conference team - Amy Roguski, Ali Curwin, Lexi Cross and Schylar Healy.

Despite losing five senior starters from last season, including leading scorer Casey Ancarrow, the Dukes return their second leading scorer from a year ago in Roguski. Roguski put away 34 goals last season. Curwin was also a key contributor on offense last season, scoring 20 goals and assisting 12 more.

Cross is one of James Madison's top returning defenders after finishing second on the team with 27 ground balls last year, and leading the squad with 15 caused turnovers.

Healy returns in cage for the Dukes after accumulating a 9-6 record a year ago in 15 starts. She led the team with 33 ground balls, also posting a 9.52 GAA and a .486 save percentage.

Hokie Notes

- -- The Hokies return six starters from last season, including five of the team's top seven scorers from a year ago.
- -- Tech finished the 2013 season at 8-8 and has yet to suffer a losing season since head coach Megan Burker took over in 2011.
- --- Seniors Julia Heaps, Kelly Naslonski, Lindsay Roche and Becca Niles will captain the Hokies this season.
- -- Tech welcomes 10 freshmen this season, as well as two new assistant coaches.
- -- Entering the season, seven of Tech's opponents are ranked the national polls, with two more, including James Madison, receiving votes.
- -- Junior Meg Bartley returns for the Hokies this year after leading the ACC in draw controls last season and ranking in the top 20 in the nation.
- -- The Hokies had six players named to the All-ACC Academic team last year, three of which are on the 2014 roster (Macera, Naslonski, Will).

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a number of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Tech begins the season facing James Madison, who is receiving votes in the IWLCA Poll. All seven of Tech's conference opponents rank in the top 20 in both polls with five of them ranking in the top 10

Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in two of the last three seasons, and earned their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Record Watch

Junior Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, and is in sixth place with 112 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking second with 69 last year.

Redshirt senior Julia Heaps is on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as she has 30 career assists, needing just five more to crack the list.

Junior Megan Will's 42 goals last season landed her on the single-season scoring list, ranking seventh. She is on pace to break into the all-time scoring list this season. She has 72 goals entering the season.

Will to be the Best

Junior Megan Will scored in 13 of the team's 16 games last season, tallying four or more points in eight of those outings. She led the team in scoring with 42 goals, including a pair of six-goal performances, at UC Davis and against Longwood.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Junior Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after

scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and finished last season leading the league in the category, averaging 4.92 draws per game. She also ranked 12th in the nation.

Big Off The Bench

Senior captain Kelly Naslonski gave the Hokies dependable production off the bench last season. Playing in 13 games and earning two starts, Naslonski scored 10 goals and finished the year second on the team with 13 assists.

Seasoned Sophomores

Sophomores Jessi Thon and Meghan Macera both earned starting jobs early on for the Hokies in their collegiate debuts last season. Both players started more than half Tech's games a season ago and ranked among the conference's best in ground balls and draws, respectively.

As freshmen, the pair combined for 11 goals, 37 ground balls, 49 draws and 16 caused turnovers.
