

Series Info

All Time vs. High Point: 2-0 · At VT: 1-0 · At HPU: 1-1 · Neutral: 0-0 Notes: The Hokies hold the all-time series edge against High Point, and have never lost to the Panthers at home ... Tech dropped the last meeting a season ago in North Carolina ... The Hokies fell 9-5 last year at High Point despite being down just 2-1 at the half ... Tech scored 18 goals in each of its wins over the Panthers, who are in their fourth year at the varsity level ... The Panthers are the first of four Big South opponents on Tech's 2014 schedule.

Scouting High Point

The Panthers enter the midweek game at 1-1 on the year. They opened the season with an 11-6 win over American at home, but later traveled to then-No. 8 Florida and fell 18-7 to the Gators. Blacksburg will be the second stop on a four-game road swing for the Panthers.

MacKenzie Carroll is leading the Panthers in scoring so far this season with four goals, while Alec Perry has tallied five points through the team's first two games by way of three goals and two assists.

Christie Dougherty has paced High Point's defensive efforts early in the year with four ground balls and three caused turnovers. Julia Burns has been the Panthers' go-to in cage so far, starting both of the team's games, allowing 10.31 goals and making 14 saves, good for a .412 save percentage.

High Point finished last season with a 10-9 record, 6-1 in the Big South. The Panthers won their conference tournament and made their second straight NCAA Tournament appearance, but were bounced in the first round.

Hokie Notes

- -- Redshirt senior Julia Heaps set a career high with five goals and seven points in the season opener at James Madison.
- -- The Hokies return six starters from last season, including five of the team's top seven scorers from a year ago.
- -- Tech finished the 2013 season at 8-8 and has yet to suffer a losing season since head coach Megan Burker took over in 2011.
- -- Seniors Julia Heaps, Kelly Naslonski, Lindsay Roche and Becca Niles will captain the Hokies this season.
- -- Tech welcomes 10 freshmen this season, as well as two new assistant coaches.
- -- In this week's polls, seven of Tech's opponents are rankednationally, with another receiving votes.
- -- Junior Meg Bartley returns for the Hokies this year after leading the ACC in draw controls last season and ranking in the top 20 in the nation.
- -- The Hokies had six players named to the All-ACC Academic team last year, three of which are on the 2014 roster (Macera, Naslonski, Will).

Last Time Out

The Hokies opened the 2014 season on Saturday at James Madison and fell to the Dukes 14-11. Keeping with the recent trend it was a close battle between the nearby teams throughout the game.

A pair of runs in the beginning of the second half helped the Dukes create and maintain some distance.

Julia Heaps had a career day with five goals and seven points, while Lindsay Roche caused four tunovers and Meagh Graham made her collegiate debut in goal, making seven saves.

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a number of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Tech began the season facing James Madison, who is receiving votes in the IWLCA Poll. All seven of Tech's conference opponents rank in the top 20 in both polls with five of them ranking in the top 10.

Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in two of the last three seasons, and earned their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Record Watch

Junior Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, and istied for fifth place with 117 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking second with 69 last year.

Redshirt senior Julia Heaps is on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as she has 32 career assists, needing just three more to crack the list.

Junior Megan Will's 42 goals last season landed her on the single-season scoring list, ranking seventh. She is on pace to break into the all-time scoring list this season. She has 73 goals so far.

Will to be the Best

Junior Megan Will scored in 13 of the team's 16 games last season, tallying four or more points in eight of those outings. She led the team in scoring with 42 goals, including a pair of six-goal performances, at UC Davis and against Longwood.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Junior Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and finished last season leading the league in the category, averaging 4.92 draws per game. She also ranked 12th in the nation.

Big Off The Bench

Senior captain Kelly Naslonski gave the Hokies dependable production off the bench last season. Playing in 13 games and earning two starts, Naslonski scored 10 goals and finished the year second on the team with 13 assists.

Seasoned Sophomores

Sophomores Jessi Thon and Meghan Macera both earned starting jobs early on for the Hokies in their collegiate debuts last season. Both players started more than half Tech's games a season ago and ranked among the conference's best in ground balls and draws, respectively.

As freshmen, the pair combined for 11 goals, 37 ground balls, 49 draws and 16 caused turnovers.

Veteran Advantage

Redshirt senior Julia Heaps got her final season as a Hokie off to an impressive start at James Madison. Heaps has a career day, setting new highs in goals (5) and points (7), while inching herself closer to having her name on Tech's all-time assists list with two in the game.
