Notes: The Hokies are 1-0 against Coastal Carolina after topping the Chanticleers, 18-8, last season on the road ... Megan Will helped lead Tech to victory last year with three goals and an assist, while Cawley Bromley (1g, 2a) and Kelly Naslonski (2g, 2a) both had breakout games for the Hokies off the bench ... Coastal Carolina is in its second year as a varsity program.

Scouting Coastal Carolina

The Chanticleers enter the weekend matchup at 2-6 on the year, and are 0-3 on the road so far, coming off a 12-11 loss at Cincinnati. This will be the third straight road game for Coastal Carolina and the loss to the Bearcats was its fourth in a row. While the Chanticleers allow just over 11 goals per game, they are also scoring in double figures themselves, averaging 10 goals per outing.

Sara Nolan leads the Coastal Carolina offense with 15 goals, while Keri White adds 13 goals and five assists to pace the team in the points column.

On the defensive end, Nyra Constant has grabbed 15 ground balls and caused 12 turnovers for the Chanticleers. Trista Kuehn has been the go-to in cage for Coastal so far this season, starting seven of the team's eight games. She boasts a .380 save percentage, making 38 saves and is 1-5 on the year.

Hokie Notes

-- Junior Cawley Bromley had a career game at William & Mary, scoring three goals and finishing with four points

-- Against No. 6 Duke, the Hokie defense forced the Blue Devils into a season-high 18 turnovers with their average of 10 coming in the first half, also holding them to a season-low four first-half goals.

-- Entering the week, three Hokies rank among the top 30 in the nation in their respective categories. Junior Meg Bartley ranks the highest of the group, tied for 9th in the country averaging 5.50 draws per game.

-- Redshirt senior Julia Heaps set a career high with five goals and seven points in the season opener at James Madison.

-- Junior Megan Will needs one goal to break onto Tech's all-time scoring list.

-- Redshirt senior Julia Heaps became the second Hokie on the 2014 roster to rank among the all-time best as her three assists against High Point broke her onto the list.

-- Junior Meg Bartley is the only player to have scored in every game so far this season.

-- In this week's polls, seven of Tech's opponents are ranked nationally, with another receiving votes.

-- The Hokies return six starters from last season, including five of the team's top seven scorers from a year ago.

-- Seniors Julia Heaps, Kelly Naslonski, Lindsay Roche and Becca Niles captain the Hokies this season.

-- Tech welcomes 10 freshmen this season, as well as two new assistant coaches.

Last Time Out

The Hokies bounced back in a dramatic way over the weekend as they came from behind to top William & Mary, 11-10, on the road. The win snapped a three-game losing streak and got Tech back at .500 on the year. Junior Megan Wil led the way for Tech with four goals and two assists, while her classmate Cawley Bromley had a career game with three goals and four points.

Down 3-0 early on, Will got the Hokies on the board and put away back-to-back goals just past the midway point in the opening half to give the game its first tie at 4-4. Despite being down two goals at the break, Tech worked its way back into it and tied things up twice in the second half before taking their first lead of the game with 15:35 left in the game.

Just minutes later William & Mary scored a free position goal and the Tech coaching staff called for a stick check on the goal and the score was called back due to an illegal stick. Tech dominated possession for the remainder of the game and held on to pick up the victory. Hannah Sieger played in the entire second half in goal for the Hokies and finished the game with nine saves and her first career decision.

The Nation's Elite

Entering the week of play, three Hokies rank among the top players in the nation in their respective categories. Junior Meg Bartley boasts the highest ranking, as she is tied for 9th with a 5.50 draws average. Junior Megan Will is tied for 23rd in the country with 31 points so far this year. Sophomore Meghan Macera's 2.88 ground balls per game is good for 22nd in the nation.

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a number of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Tech has already faced three ranked opponents this season, most recently hosting No. 6 Duke. All seven of Tech's conference opponents rank in the top 20 in both polls with six of them ranking in the top 10.

Although Tech is just 5-76 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in two of the last three seasons.

Record Watch

Junior Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, and ranks fourth with 156 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking second with 69 last year.

Redshirt senior Julia Heaps broke into the all-time assists list against High Point earlier this year. She currently ranks eighth all-time with 40.

Junior Megan Will's 42 goals last season landed her on the single-season scoring list, ranking seventh. She is on pace to break into the all-time scoring list this season, needing just one more goal to be tied for tenth. Will has scored 92 goals to date.

Scoring at Will

Junior Megan Will has scored in seven of eight games for the Hokies so far this year and has had at least one point in each of the last 16 games. The Bel Air, Md., native neared a career high at Longwood, after setting the mark against the Lancers a year ago, when she put away five goals and assisted two more.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Junior Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw. After leading the league in the category a season ago, she remains atop the ACC and is 9th in the nation, averaging 5.50.

Easy Transition

Senior captain Kelly Naslonski gave the Hokies dependable production off the bench last season. Playing in 13 games and earning two starts, Naslonski scored 10 goals and finished the year second on the team with 13 assists.

So far this season she has had no trouble with her new starting role and has scored in four of the six games she has played in, missing the last two due to illness.

Seasoned Sophomores

With a year of on-field experience under their belts, sophomores Meghan Macera and Jessi Thon have become consistent leaders in the midfield. The pair has combined for 21 points and round out the top three on the team in draws this year. Macera is second in the ACC averaging 2.88 ground balls per game, while Thon is third with 1.62 caused turnovers per game.

Veteran Advantage

Redshirt senior Julia Heaps got her final season as a Hokie off to an impressive start at James Madison. Heaps has a career day, setting new highs in goals (5) and points (7).

In the home opener against High Point, Heaps made her way onto Tech's all-time assists list with three in the game. The Street, Md., native is currently ranked eighth all-time with 40 career assists.

Graham in Goal

Freshman goalie Meagh Graham has been an aggressive threat on defense and a stronghold in cage for the Hokies early in her career. Starting every game of the season, Graham is second on the team in ground balls (21) and caused turnovers (10) so far. The Kensington, Md., native ranks third in the ACC with 2.38 ground balls per game, and fifth with 5.86 saves per game.

Protecting the Cage

Tech's starting defensive unit of Lindsay Roche, Becca Niles, Kelsey Allen and Maddy Hess is newly assembled this season and entered the year with just two starts among them. So far this year the quartet has combined for 29 ground balls and 16 caused turnovers through eight games and recently notched arguably it's best performance of the year against No. 6 Duke. With the help of goalie Meagh Graham, who adds 21 ground balls and 10 caused turnovers of her own, the Hokies held Duke to a season-low four first-half goals and forced the Blue Devils into a season-high 18 turnovers in the game.
