## HOKIE NOTES

### About Today's Game

The Hokies enter the game 4-1 on the season ... Nebraska is also 4-1 this season following their 82-71 loss to UCLA on Friday night.

### Last Time Out: Texas A&M 68, VT 65

The Hokies dropped their first game of the season on Friday afternoon, as they fell 68-65 to Texas A&M in the semifinal of the Wooden Legacy in Fullerton, California ... **Ahmed Hill** led all scorers with 18 points and **Justin Robinson** added 14 points for the Hokies ... Tech was out rebounded 49-30 in the game.

### Series Against the Huskers

This is just the second all-time meeting between the two schools ... Tech won the only other meeting, 87-81, in the Puerto Rico Shootout in San Juan, Puerto Rico on Nov. 26, 1994 ... Tech is 34-51 all-time against schools currently in the Big Ten.

### Taking Good Care

The Hokies enter today's game fifth nationally in turnovers per game, averaging just 9.2 turnovers per game and seventh nationally in assist to turnover ratio, at 1.93 ... Tech is 17th in fewest turnovers ... Tech has turned the ball over 9-or-fewer times in three of the five games this season ... The most turnovers in a game this season for the Hokies was 12, in the win over VMI.

### More on National Stats

Through the games of Nov. 25, the Hokies are 33rd nationally in assists per game ... Individually, **Ahmed Hill** is 14th nationally in three-point field goals per game and 17th in total three-point field goals ... **Zach LeDay** is 39th in double-doubles.

### From 3!

The Hokies enter today's game shooting 39.3 percent from three-point range ... The school record for highest three-point field goal percentage in a season is 39.5 percent, set in the 1995-96 season ... The Hokies are averaging 9.6 made three-pointers per game this season ... The Hokies are 34th in the nation in three-point field goals per game.

### Welcome Back, Med

**Ahmed Hill** has made quite a comeback for the Hokies ... After missing the 2015-16 season following knee surgery, Hill made his Hokies return in the win over Maine ... Hill, earning the start, scored 14 points and grabbed three rebounds in 30 minutes of action ... Then, in the win over High Point, Hill scored a career-high 20 points ... He also recorded career-highs with six made three-pointers and four assists ... In the loss to Texas A&M, Hill tied his career-high in three-pointers made, going 6-for-11 from behind the arc against the Aggies ... Hill currently leads the ACC and is 14th nationally in made three-pointers per game.

### What A Day!

**Justin Robinson** had, perhaps, his best-ever performance for the Hokies in their win over New Mexico ... The sophomore point guard had a career-high 22 points, to go along with a career-high-tying eight assists ... Robinson also played a career-high 40 minutes, but did not commit a turnover in the game ... He added 14 points on Friday in the loss to Texas A&M.

### They Are Free

The Hokies made 19 of 20 free throws in the win over New Mexico, good for 95.0 percent from the line ... That is the Hokies' second-best free throw percentage in a game with at least 20 attempts of all time ... The only better performance with at least 20 attempts was a 95.7 percent night against Dayton on Dec. 17, 1976 ... In that game, the Hokies made 22 of 23 from the line ... So far in this tournament, the Hokies are a combined 29-33 from the line, for 87.9 percent ... Entering the tournament, the Hokies were shooting 59.4 percent from the free throw line for the season.

### Strong Start for LeDay

Senior **Zach LeDay** started the 2016-17 season right where he ended last season, on a hot note ... LeDay led the Hokies with 20 points and 12 rebounds in the win over Maine ... It marked his 13th double-double at Virginia Tech and the fifth double-double with at least 20 points ... It also marks his third consecutive double-double and his fourth in his last five games ... The performance is the first Hokie to have a 20-point double-double off the bench since Jeff Allen had 24 points and 13 rebounds off the bench in a win over VMI on Dec. 9, 2009 ... LeDay followed that with 12 points in the win over High Point ... In the win over VMI, LeDay had his second double-double of the season with 23 points and 12 rebounds ... He has scored in double figures in four of the five games this season.

### Hokie Odds & Ends

The Hokies have not had a player foul out of a game this season ... **Ahmed Hill**, who is averaging 28.6 minutes per games, has committed just one turnover ... **Justin Robinson** has a 3:1 assist to turnover ratio ... As a team, the Hokies have almost a 2:1 assist to turnover ratio ... No Hokie is averaging more than two turnovers per game.

### A Fine Start

**Khadim Sy** made his collegiate debut in the win over Maine ... The freshman post earned the start and had a solid six points, four rebounds and team-high three blocked shots in the win ... In the win over High Point, Sy recorded his first double-figure scoring game of his career, with 14 points on 6-of-9 from the field ... He also had a team-high six rebounds ... Sy took it a step further in the win over New Mexico, as he grabbed a team-high 10 rebounds, the most for the freshman this season.

### Hot from the Field

In the win over High Point, the Hokies shot 56.1 percent from the field, the most in a game since shooting 61.0 percent in the win over Liberty on Nov. 19, 2014 ... In the win over VMI, the Hokies shot 60.0 percent ... That marked the first time that the Hokies have shot 55 percent or better from the field in back-to-back games since Jan. 23 and 28, 2007, when Tech shot 58.1 percent at Miami and 59.9 percent at Georgia Tech.

### Sharing is Good

In the win over High Point, Tech had 24 assists ... It's the most in a single game for the Hokies since Tech had 25 assists in a win over Charleston Southern on Jan. 7, 2008 ... The Hokies had 19 assists in the win over VMI ... Combined with the 24 assists against High Point, this marks the first time that the Hokies have had 19-or-more assists in back-to-back games since the second and third games of the 2011-12 season ... Tech had 20 assists against both Monmouth and FIU ... In the win over New Mexico, the Hokies dished out 20 assists ... The Hokies are fourth in the ACC and **Justin Robinson** is third in the ACC in assists.

### More on Sharing

In the win over VMI, **Justin Robinson** had six assists and **Seth Allen** and **Chris Clarke** had five assists each ... This marks the first time since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season that three Hokies had at least five assists in a single game.

### Lotsa Points

During the first four games of the 2016-17 season, the Hokies scored 359 points so far ... That was the most points scored by a Virginia Tech men's basketball team in the first four games of a season since the 1988-89 season, when Tech scored 376 total points in home wins over Wofford, William & Mary and James Madison and a road loss at Alabama ... The 1988-89 team featured Tech's all-time leading scorer Bimbo Coles and sharp-shooter Wally Lancaster.

### Making Points on Points vs. High Point

In the Hokies' win over High Point, the Hokies scored 99 points, the most points by a Virginia Tech team since a 105-92 win over VMI on Nov. 18, 2013 in Cassell Coliseum ... In the High Point win, Tech scored 60 points in the first half, the most for a Tech team since scoring 61 points in the second half of the aforementioned VMI game ... The 60 points is the most points scored in a first half since Tech joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season.

### Hit the Road, Jack

Beginning on Nov. 21, the Hokies have embarked on a 10-day, four game road trip against top-level competition ... Tech is competing in the Wooden Legacy, being played on the campus of Cal. State Fullerton and the Honda Center in Anaheim ... The final game will be held in Honda Center, home of the Anaheim Ducks, on Sunday ... Tech then heads off to Ann Arbor, Michigan, to play the Wolverines in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Wed., Nov. 30.

### Beating Top Teams

Last season, the Hokies won two games against top 10 teams, the first time that had happened since Tech defeated three top 10 (actually top 5) teams in the 2006-07 season.

### Finishing Strong

Last season, **Zach LeDay** was named honorable mention All-ACC by both the coaches and the media ... In the four games he played following that announcement, LeDay scored a total of 73 points and grabbed 40 rebounds ... He averaged 18.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in those four contests and recorded three double-doubles.

### The 400 & 500 Clubs

With **Zach LeDay's** 543 points, **Seth Allen's** 514 points and **Justin Bibbs' 411** points, the Hokies had three 400-plus point scorers on the same team since Malcolm Delaney (667 pts.), Dorenzo Hudson (500 pts.) and Jeff Allen (409 pts.) accomplished the feat in the 2009-10 season ... That season was also the last year that Tech had two 500-point scorers.

### Winning Streak

The Hokies won six consecutive games against ACC competition after defeating Florida State in the ACC Tournament last season, the first time since the 1964-65 season that has occurred, when the Hokies won eight consecutive games against conference foes ... That was Tech's final season in the Southern Conference.

### Who Returns from Missing Last Year

The Hokies return two players who missed last season due to medical issues ... **Ahmed Hill**, who averaged 8.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game as a freshman two seasons ago, returns after missing last season following off-season knee surgery ... **Ty Outlaw**, a junior college transfer who missed last season due to a medical issue, also returns to action this season ... Hill is second on the team in scoring at 15.2 points per game and Outlaw has made six of 13 three-point attempts this season.

### Double Century Marks

In the win over Maine, Virginia Tech guard **Justin Robinson** dished out his 100th career assist and **Seth Allen** did the same in the win over VMI.

### O Canada

Virginia Tech assistant coach **Jamie McNeilly** spent some of his summer in Chile ... He was an assistant coach with the Canadian National team at the FIBA U18 Americas Championship in Valdivia, Chile, a team that featured Virginia Tech signee Nickeil Alexander-Walker and finished with the Silver Medal ... Last summer, he was an assistant with the Canadian team at the FIBA U19 Championship in Herkalion, Greece, where **Justin Bibbs' USA** Basketball team won the gold medal ... McNeilly has contributed to the Canadian National team system since 2011.

### Balanced Time

The Hokies have only one player averaging 30 minutes of action per game this season ... Six Hokies are averaging between 24 and 30 minutes of action this season ... Eight Hokies are averaging in double-figures in minutes played so far this season.

### 200 and Rising

**Zach LeDay** grabbed 275 rebounds last year ... That is the most rebounds in a season for a Virginia Tech player since 2010-11, when Jeff Allen had 330 boards ... He is on a similar pace again this season.

### Solid Returns

The Hokies returned their top four players in scoring average from last season and eight of the top nine ... Tech returned the top five players in rebounding average from last season ... Only one player that averaged at least 20 minutes per game last year did not return this season.

### Scoring Balance

Entering today's game, the Hokies have four players averaging in double figures ... The Hokies have played 10 players this season and nine have scored at least 10 points so far ... Four players have scored at least 55 points, but no Hokie has scored more than 80 points so far.

### HEAD COACH BUZZ WILLIAMS



In his two years at Virginia Tech, Buzz Williams already has ushered in an exciting new era of basketball. The head coach of the men's squad is beginning his third season here in Blacksburg, and he has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take a simplistic, yet very

effective approach – “Get Better.”

Last season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long way toward establishing an identity – one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature. Williams compiled a 31-37 record in his first two seasons in Blacksburg.

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new highs in this area. And while he has been able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more on finding what he likes to call, “OKGs”, or “our kind of guys.”

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players made it to the NBA during Williams’ tenure. In his nine-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 188-124.

“The growth of the Hokies’ basketball program and the renewed energy under Buzz Williams in his first two seasons has been remarkable,” Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. “We’ve seen improvement in all facets. He’s an educator first and foremost. He loves his players. They play hard for him. Everyone within the program and around the department has embraced Buzz’s work ethic, passion, and attention to detail. We certainly have positive momentum and want to do all we can to keep it going. We believe in Coach Williams and his staff. Exciting times in Blacksburg.”

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 20 seasons, and 2016-17 will mark his 10th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07, and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games



coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA

Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
