The Hokies enter the game 19-8 overall and 8-7 in ACC action ... Boston College is 9-19 overall and 2-13 in conference play ... This is the second of two meetings this season ... Tech defeated BC, 85-79, in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 29.

Last Time Out: VT 71, Clemson 70

The Hokies won another tight game, 71-70, over Clemson on Tuesday night in Cassell Coliseum ... **Seth Allen** made a three-pointer from the top of the key with 3.8 seconds remaining to give the Hokies the win ... **Zach LeDay** led the Hokies with 19 points and **Justin Bibbs** and **Ahmed Hill** had 12 points each in the win ... **Justin Robinson** had 10 points and eight assists.

Series Against the Eagles

The Eagles lead the series, 18-10 ... Tech has won the last two meetings, most recently an 85-79 victory in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 29 ... Tech won the last meeting in Conte Forum, 71-56, last season ... Tech is 2-11 in road games against BC ... Virginia Tech is 8-12 against the Eagles since Boston College joined the ACC in the 2005-06 season.

The Shot

The Hokies defeated Clemson, 71-70, in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 21 ... Trailing 70-68 with 7.4 seconds remaining, the Hokies in-bounded the ball to **Seth Allen**, who made a three-pointer from the top of the key with 3.8 second remaining to give the Hokies the win ... It was Allen's second game-winning basket in as many home games, as he scored the game-winner in double overtime against No. 12/13 Virginia on Feb. 12 ... He has hit the eventual game-winner in four of the Hokies' eight ACC wins this season.

On Top of the List

Justin Bibbs is 175-406 from three-point range for his career, good for 43.1 percent ... He is currently fifth all-time in three-point field goal percentage in the ACC, having passed Jeff Lebo of North Carolina and Archie Miller of NC State in the win over Clemson on Tuesday ... He is currently tops at Virginia Tech, as the existing school mark is 40.9 percent, set by Brian Chase from 1999-2003 ... Bibbs is also nearing 1,000 career points at Virginia Tech ... He enters tonight's game at 988 points ... In his last four games, Bibbs is 14-27 from three-point range, for 51.9 percent.

Playing the Percentages

The Hokies are shooting 39.8 percent from beyond the arc this season ... The school record for three-point field goal percentage for a season is 39.5 percent, set in the 1995-96 season ... The Hokies are shooting 40.3 percent from three-point territory in ACC games this season ... The standing school record for three-point percentage in ACC games is 38.7 percent in the 2014-15 season.

Making Shots

The Hokies lead the ACC field goal percentage in conference games and are second in all games this season ... Tech leads the ACC in three-point field goal percentage in both categories ... Tech is 20th nationally in field goal percentage and ?? in three-point field goal percentage ... Tech is shooting 48.1 percent from the field in ACC play and 48.5 percent in all games ... Tech is shooting 40.3 percent from three-point range in conference games and 39.8 percent in all games ... The Hokies shot 51.0 percent from the floor at UNC and are the first ACC opponent to make better than 50 percent of their shots against the Tar Heels ... Tech shot 59.1 percent from the field in the win over Boston College and 59.2 percent from the field at Louisville.

Better Percentages

The Hokies are shooting better this season, as compared to last season ... Last season, the Hokies shot 44.9 percent from the field and 34.8 percent from three-point range ... This season, Tech is shooting 48.5 percent from the field and 39.8 percent from three-point range ... Tech also has improved upon last season's 69.7 percent from the line, now shooting 72.1 percent ... Tech averaged 12.2 assists per game last season; that has improved to 15.2 per game this season.

Solid Stats for LeDay

Zach LeDay has posted some great numbers for the Hokies this season ... LeDay has scored in double figures in 26 of the 27 games, including three games of 20-or-more-points ... He leads the Hokies in scoring, at 15.5 points per game and in rebounding (among active players), at 7.0 boards per game ... In the win over Syracuse, he tied his ACC-high of 22 points ... LeDay grabbed his 400th Virginia Tech rebound against Notre Dame ... He recorded his third double-double of the season in the loss at Miami and his fourth in the win at Pittsburgh ... LeDay's streak of 22 consecutive double-figure scoring games is the best current streak in the ACC.

Moving On Up

The Hokies are shooting 72.1 percent from the free throw line ... Entering the Jan. 18 game against Georgia Tech, the Hokies were shooting 69.8 percent from the line ... Since then, the Hokies have made 149 of 194 free throw attempts, good for 76.8 percent ... Tech is shooting 72.4 percent from the line in ACC competition.

Putting the Ball in the Basket

The Hokies are averaging 78.8 points per game this season ... The last time the Hokies averaged more points per game than that number was in the 1988-89 season, when the Hokies averaged 87.2 points per game ... Tech averaged 75.0 points per game last season, the most since the 1994-95 season (75.4 ppg).

Coming Back

The Hokies defeated No. 12/13 Virginia, 80-78, in double overtime in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 12 and trailed the Cavaliers, 37-23, at halftime ... The 14-point comeback is the most by Tech in an ACC game this season and second only to the Michigan game, where Tech came back from a 15 point deficit ... The 14 point comeback in the win over Virginia is the largest for Tech in an ACC game since coming back from a 16 point deficit to defeat NC State in the first conference game of last season ... The Hokies followed that game with a 13-point come-from-behind win at Pittsburgh on Feb. 14 ... Tech's ACC record for largest comeback victory is 18 points, in a 91-87 overtime win over NC State on Feb. 8, 2009 in Cassell Coliseum.

Strong Play by Allen

Seth Allen returned to the line-up in the win over Syracuse after missing the Florida State game due to an injury ... Allen has scored in double figures in 10 of the 12 games since returning ... In that span, he is averaging 15.1 points per game ... Allen scored 20 points in the win over Virginia and made a big three-pointer late in the win over Pittsburgh ... He scored 25 points in the loss at Louisville and made the game-winning three-pointer in the final seconds in the home win over Clemson.

Improvement from 3

Last season, **Seth Allen** was 44 of 157 from three-point range, for 28.0 percent ... This season, he has made 45 of 93 three-point attempts, for 48.4 percent from three-point range ... He is 29 of 57 (50.9 percent) from three-point range in ACC games this season.

Whew, That's Close

The Hokies are 8-7 in ACC games this season ... In the last six victories, the Hokies have won by more than three points just once, an 85-79 home win over Boston College ... Tech has won by double digits just twice this ACC season, 89-75 over Duke and 83-73 over Syracuse ... The outcome of each of the Hokies last four games has been four points or fewer ... Tech is 5-2 in ACC games this season decided by five-or-fewer points and 7-3 in all games this season decided by five-or-fewer points.

Clarke Out

Virginia Tech forward **Chris Clarke** suffered a tear in the the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee and will miss the remainder of the season ... He injured the knee in the second half of the win over Virginia ... He underwent successful surgery on Feb. 17.

Being Stingy is a Good Thing

In the win over Syracuse, the Hokies committed a season-low six turnovers ... The previous low was seven against Texas A&M ... This is the fewest turnovers in an ACC game for the Hokies since committing six turnovers against Wake Forest on Jan. 13, 2016 ... Tech committed just eight turnovers in the win at Pitt and just nine in the loss at No. 8/7 Louisville and the home win over Clemson.

In the win at Pittsburgh, **Justin Robinson** tied his career-high with eight assists ... He did so while committing just two turnovers in 35 minutes of action ... In the home win over Clemson, he had eight assists with three turnovers ... In the Pitt win, he also dished out his 200th career assist in just his 60th career game ... He has 26 assists and just nine turnovers in the last four games ... He has 217 career assists, to just 123 career turnovers.

Have a Day, Ty!

In the loss at Louisville, **Ty Outlaw** scored a career-high 19 points ... He made a career-high five three-pointers in a career-high 35 minutes of action ... He was 7-of-8 from the field, including 5-6 from three-point range ... He also grabbed seven rebounds, tying a career-high and setting a personal best in an ACC game.

Close Games vs. the Tigers

The Hokies defeated Clemson, 71-70 in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 21, after defeating the Tigers 82-81 in Littlejohn Coliseum on Jan. 22 ... Since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season, Tech has played the Tigers 20 times ... Of those 20 games, 14 have been decided by 5-or-fewer points ... Four more have been decided by 10-or-fewer points ... In those 20 games, only 22 points divide the two teams and only a 23 point difference in all 33 games.

Threes All Around

The Hokies were 17 of 26 from three-point range in the loss at No. 8/7 Louisville on Saturday ... The 17 three-pointers sets a new school record for three-pointers in a game, breaking the old mark of 16 three-pointers in a 93-90 loss to Marquette in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech shot 65.4 percent from three-point range in the Louisville game, second-best this season ... Tech has shot better than 60 percent from three-point territory three times in ACC play this season ... Tech's 17 three-pointers set a KFC Yum! Center record for an opponent with 17 made 3s ... That matched UofL's record at the KFC Yum! Center (Morgan State, Dec. 27, 2010) ... Tech set a record for a UofL opponent in a non-overtime game with 17 made three-pointers (WVU made 18 in a 2005 Elite Eight overtime game).

More About Threes

Seth Allen was 6-of-8 from three-point range in the Louisville game, setting a new career-high for him and one off the school record ... **Ty Outlaw** also had a career-high with five three-pointers in the game ... **Justin Bibbs**, the school's all-time leader in three-point field goal percentage was 3-of-5 from three-point range in the game.

More About the Game

Virginia Tech's 90 points were the most by an opponent in the KFC Yum! Center and the most in a Louisville home game since Villanova scored 92 in January 2010 ... The previous record by an opponent in the KFC Yum! Center was 87 by Memphis in December 2011 ... **Seth Allen's** 25 points are the most by a Hokie in an ACC regular season game since Allen had 28 points at Pittsburgh last season ... The Hokies placed five players in double figures.

The Big 2-0-0

Buzz Williams won his 200th career game with the win over Boston College on Jan. 29 and has a 203-131 record in his 10th season as a collegiate head coach ... He is 50-45 in his third season at Virginia Tech ... He was recognized for his 200th win prior to the Virginia game.

Lights, Camera, Action!

So far this season, the Hokies have played a total of 14 games on one of the three ESPN over-the-air networks ... In those games, Tech is a combined 12-2 ... Tech is 1-1 on ESPN, 3-0 on ESPN2 and 8-1 on ESPNU ... Tech won all three of its Sunday night ESPNU games ... The Hokies will play Miami on Monday night on ESPN2 and at least one game on the family of networks in the 2017 ACC Tournament.

Milestones, Here and Approaching

Several Hokies have either reached or are approaching milestones ... **Justin Bibbs** is 12 points shy of 1,000 for his career ... **Zach LeDay** needs 39 points for 1,000 at Virginia Tech and scored his 400th point of the season in the home win over Clemson ... At Miami, **Chris Clarke** pulled down his 300th rebound and had his 50th assist ... **Justin Robinson** scored his 500th career point in the win over UVa and recorded his 200th career assist at Pitt ... In the win at Pitt, **Ahmed Hill** scored his 600th career point.

Getting to the Line More

This season, the Hokies are 427 of 592 from the free throw line, for 72.1 percent ... Tech opponents have shot just 425 free throws this season ... In ACC play, Tech has made 53 more free throws than its opponents.

Nearing Marks

The Hokies enter today's game with 208 assists in ACC play ... The school record is 220, set in the 2014-15 season ... Tech had 206 assists in ACC games last season ... The Hokies have made 235 three-pointers this season ... The school record is 241 threes, set in the 2014-15 season.

Great Numbers

The Hokies are 19-8 this season ... This marks the team's best start through 27 games since the 2009-10 season, when Tech started the 21-6 ... The Hokies have reached 19 victories the earliest since that same 2009-10 season ... The Hokies finished the month of November this season, 6-1 overall and finished December, 6-0 ... Tech's 6-0 is its first undefeated December since 2009-10, when Tech finished that December 7-0.

Making Some Points on Points

The Hokies lost at Louisville, 94-90 ... The 90 points is the team's most in an ACC game this season and third-highest point total in any game this season ... The last time the Hokies scored more than 90 points in an ACC game was Jan. 13, 2016, when Tech defeated Wake Forest, 93-91, in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the most points that Tech has scored in an ACC non-overtime loss and the second most in any ACC loss.

OT, Baby

The 80-78 double overtime win over Virginia is the Hokies fourth consecutive overtime win over Virginia ... The Hokies are now 4-5 in overtime games against the Cavaliers ... Tech is 1-1 in double-overtime games against Virginia ... This was the Hokies' first overtime game since defeating Princeton, 86-81 in overtime on March 16, 2016 ... Tech is now 65-49 overall in overtime games and 5-3 in overtime games under **Buzz Williams** ... Tech is 30-11 in home overtime games and 16-8 in overtime in ACC games ... The Hokies are now 2-4 against nationally-ranked teams this season.

He smashed that number in the win over The Citadel, when he recorded a career-high 10 assists ... Last season he averaged 1.5 assists per game and this season; that rose to 3.3 assists ... His 10 assists in The Citadel game is the most assists by a Hokie since **Devlin Wilson** had 11 assists in a loss to No. 4 Duke on Feb. 25, 2015 ... In the win over Syracuse, he dished out a new personal ACC-high of six assists ... To go along with his assists numbers, **Chris Clarke** had 21 steals in 22 games last season ... He has 30 steals in 24 games this season ... He leads the Hokies in steals this season ... Clarke will miss the remainder of the season with a knee injury.

Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Ty Likes 3s

Ty Outlaw has made 43 field goals ... Of that number, 32 have come from three-point range ... He was 3-for-5 from three-point range at NC State ... Both of his baskets at Florida State were two-point field goals, the first time this season he has had two, two-pointers in the same game ... He was 5-of-6 from three-point range in the loss at Louisville.

Hokies in the National Stats

Through the games of Feb. 22, Tech is 17th nationally in three-point field goal percentage, 20th in field goal percentage and 29th in fewest fouls ... **Chris Clarke** is one of 20 players nationally and one of three in the ACC to record a triple-double this season.

LeDay is Solid from the Line

In the Hokies' last nine games, **Zach LeDay** is 46-56 from the free throw line, good for 82.1 percent ... He is shooting 77.4 percent from the line this season and 76.9 percent from the line in ACC play.

Less than 48 hours after the Hokies' 80-78 double overtime victory over No. 12/13 Virginia, Tech was back on the court in Pittsburgh ... The Hokies played their first game without **Chris Clarke**, who was lost for the season in the UVa win ... Trailing by 11 points at the half and by 13 points early in the second half, Tech recorded its second consecutive double-digit come-from-behind ACC victory ... Tech played eight players, but two played fewer than 10 minutes each ... Although out rebounded 43-29, Tech forced the Panthers into 13 turnovers, while committing just eight ... Tech committed a season-low-tying 10 fouls and made 12-of-15 free throw attempts ... Tech also assisted on 16 of its 22 made baskets ... The Hokies defeated the Panthers in Pittsburgh for the first time since Jan. 23, 1967.

That Virginia Game on Feb. 12

Less than two weeks after falling at Virginia, 71-48, the Hokies won an epic rematch, 80-78, in double overtime in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 12 ... Tech came back from a 14 point halftime deficit to tie the game on a **Ty Outlaw** put-back in the final second of regulation ... **Seth Allen** scored the game-winning basket in the lane with 3.1 seconds remaining in the second overtime for the Hokies ... Tech played both overtimes without leading scorer **Zach LeDay**, who fouled out with 1:22 remaining in regulation and **Chris Clarke**, who had suffered a torn ACL in his left knee in the second half ... The Hokies have defeated the Cavaliers in Cassell in consecutive years for the first time since the 2009-10 and 2008-09 seasons ... Those years were the last two of a four consecutive home win streak against UVa ... In the win, **Justin Bibbs** tied the school record for minutes played in an ACC game, with 46 ... In all, three Hokies played more than 40 minutes in the game.

Head coach **Buzz Williams** has announced that **Matt Galloway** has earned a full scholarship for the spring semester ... Galloway, who graduated last May with a degree in history, is currently in graduate school at Virginia Tech ... He joined the team last season as a walk-on.

In the Hokies' win over The Citadel, **Chris Clarke** recorded the Hokies' first-ever triple-double, scoring 13 points, grabbing 12 rebounds and dishing out a career-high 10 assists ... Clarke is one of three ACC players with a triple-double this season ... He scored 185 points in 22 games last season and 274 points in his 24 games this season.

575 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 575-189 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, for a .753 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State in 2011 was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons ... Tech is 14-1 in Cassell this year, 6-1 in ACC games.

Making Shots

The Hokies shot 63.6 percent in the first half of the win over Boston College, their second-highest percent in a half this season and the best in an ACC game this season ... Tech matched that number in the second half at Louisville ... The Hokies' 72.7 percent from three-point territory in the first half against BC is their highest percentage of the season in ACC play and the second-highest overall ... The Hokies shot 66.7 percent from three-point territory in the win over Boston College ... It is the highest percentage in a game since Tech shot 66.7 percent in a win over Morgan State on Nov. 30, 2014 ... It ties the school's record for three-point percentage in an ACC game ... The Hokies shot 59.2 percent from the floor in the loss at Louisville, the team's third-best of the season and best in ACC play ... Tech shot 59.1 percent in the win over Boston College on Jan. 22.

What a Sellout, x4

Virginia Tech has sold out four games this season ... The sellouts are the home opener against Maine and ACC games against Duke, Notre Dame and Virginia ... The Duke game sold out less than 24 hours after single game ACC tickets went on sale to Hokie Club members and season ticket holders.

Beating Top Teams

Last season, the Hokies won two games against top 10 teams, including a home win over No. 7 Miami ... That marked the first time that had happened since Tech defeated three top 10 (actually top 5) teams in the 2006-07 season ... Tech added another Top 5 victory this season, defeating No. 5/5 Duke, 89-75, on Dec. 31 ... Tech is 2-5 against ranked teams this season, 1-2 against top 10 teams.

With the four sellouts this season, the Hokies are averaging 7,371 per game this season ... Last season, the Hokies averaged 6,658 and in the 2014-15 season, Tech averaged 5,744 ... This year's attendance would be the largest for the Hokies since averaging 8,395 in the 2010-11 season ... Last season, the Hokies averaged 7,529 for nine ACC home games; this season, Tech is averaging 7.985 through seven ACC home games.

A Good Night from the Line

The Hokies made 16 of 17 free throw attempts in the win at Clemson, for 94.1 percent ... That marked the third time this season that Tech had shot better than 90 percent from the line ... Tech made 19 of 20 attempts in the win over New Mexico in the Wooden Legacy and 19 of 21 attempts in the win at Michigan in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge ... The last time the Hokies made at least 94 percent from the line in an ACC game (attempting at least 10 free throws) was on March 4, 2009, when the Hokies made all of their 17 free throw attempts in an 86-78 home win over No. 2 North Carolina ... Tech was 7-of-8 from the line in the home win over Clemson.

O Canada

Virginia Tech assistant coach **Jamie McNeilly** spent some of his summer in Chile ... He was an assistant coach with the Canadian National team at the FIBA U18 Americas Championship in Valdivia, Chile, a team that featured Virginia Tech signee Nickeil Alexander-Walker and finished with the Silver Medal ... Last summer, he was an assistant with the Canadian team at the FIBA U19 Championship in Heraklion, Greece, where **Justin Bibbs'** USA Basketball team won the gold medal ... McNeilly has contributed to the Canadian National team since 2011.

Scoring Balance

The Hokies have five players averaging in double figures ... The Hokies have played 11 players this season and eight have scored at least 100 points ... Six players have scored at least 200 points, and three of those have scored more than 300 points ... **Zach LeDay** has scored 416 points this season to lead the Hokies.

In his two years-plus at Virginia Tech, Buzz Williams already has ushered in an exciting new era of basketball. The head coach of the men's squad is in his third season here in Blacksburg, and he has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take

a simplistic, yet very effective approach – "Get Better."

On Jan. 29, 2017, the Hokies defeated Boston College, 85-79, to give Williams his 200th career victory. Now in his 10th season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 203-131. Williams has compiled a 50-45 record in his first three seasons in Blacksburg.

Last season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an identity – one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature.

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new heights in this area. And while he has been

able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more on finding what he likes to call, "OKGs", or "our kind of guys."

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure.

"The growth of the Hokies' basketball program and the renewed energy under Buzz Williams in his first two seasons has been remarkable," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "We've seen improvement in all facets. He's an educator first and foremost. He loves his players. They play hard for him. Everyone within the program and around the department has embraced Buzz's work ethic, passion, and attention to detail. We certainly have positive momentum and want to do all we can to keep it going. We believe in Coach Williams and his staff. Exciting times in Blacksburg."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA

Division I level for 20 seasons, and 2016-17 will mark his 10th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07, and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the



nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
