

LAST TIME OUT ...

James Shupp scored the game-winning goal in the 103rd minute and goalkeeper Kyle Renfro made a career-high nine saves as the Hokies stunned then No.1 ranked North Carolina, 1-0 in double overtime, in front of a packed house at Thompson Field on Saturday night. It was the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both teams.

Renfro posted his second career shutout and Shupp's goal was his first game-winner as a Hokie. The win was Tech's first over a No.1 ranked team since 2004 when the Hokies beat Duke, 1-0, in Durham, N.C. It was also their first win over UNC since 2007.

NEXT UP ...

On Friday, Sept. 16, Tech hits the road for the first time this year as they travel to Boston, Mass., to play nationally-ranked Boston College at 7:00 p.m. The Hokies continue the two-game road swing next Tuesday, Sept. 20 at East Tennessee State.

SCOUTING LONGWOOD...

- Longwood enters the game with a record of 1-2-1 overall. The Lancers notched their only win of the season in their opening game on August 27, with a 2-0 victory over Randolph. Longwood competes in the Atlantic Soccer Conference.
- On Saturday, Longwood played host to James Madison and tied the Dukes, 3-3, in double overtime. After trailing 2-1 at halftime, Longwood scored two goals to take a 3-2 lead, but JMU tied the game with just over seven minutes remaining in regulation. Nick Surkamp had a goal and an assist versus JMU, while Zach Mahon and Zach Crandall also scored.
- As a team, Longwood is being outscored by their opponents, 7-6. Nick Surkamp leads the Lancers in scoring with two goals and an assist for five points, while Zach Crandall has two goals for four points. In goal, Joel Helmick has started all four games and played all 380 minutes. He has 14 saves and a 1.66 goals against average.

SERIES HISTORY...

- This is the eighth all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and Longwood in men's soccer.
- The Lancers hold a 4-2-1 series lead against the Hokies. The teams have split their last two meetings during the past two years, with Tech winning, 5-1, in Blacksburg on Oct. 27, 2009, while the Lancers won at home. last year, 1-0, on Oct. 5, 2010. Longwood holds a 3-2 advantage over the Hokies during games played in Blacksburg.
- In last years's game, Longwood scored the game-winning goal in the 70th minute as Devin Pierce finished off a pass from Michael Tegler. Virginia Tech out-shot the Lancers, 10-4, and out-cornered Longwood, 5-3. James Daly had one save in goal for Tech while Joel Helmick posted the shutout for Longwood. The first meeting between Longwood and Virginia Tech in men's soccer was in 1982, as Longwood won, 2-1, in Blacksburg.

Mike Brizendine enters his third year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2010 squad played five top-20 nationally ranked opponents, including taking sixth-ranked Virginia to overtime on the road. His 2009-10 team was one of only three Atlantic Coast Conference men's soccer programs to receive the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. It marked the second time in program history and first since 2003, that the Hokies earned academic recognition from the NSCAA



An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned all-conference and all-region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.

Game-by-Game Recap

Game #1 vs. Howard | August 27 | L, 2-1

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team opened the 2011 season on Aug. 27 with a 2-1 loss to Howard at Thompson Field. All three of the goals scored in the game occurred after half-time, with two coming just 15 seconds apart in the 81st minute.

After a scoreless first half, in which Tech held a majority of the possession in the Howard half of the field, the Bison stunned the Hokies as they got on the board first when Mario Martin capitalized with a low finish from eight yards on a pass from Rahman Alarape at 59:02.

Then at 80:12, Martin again finished for Howard, this time off a pass from Akinbola Richardson, making the score 2-0 in favor of the Bison. However, Tech would get the board just 15 seconds later when Michael Garrick found David Clemens, who dribbled past Howard defenders into the box and finished off a nice individual effort from just outside the six-yard box. After their goal, the Hokies kept on pushing numbers forward as Howard tried to hold on. Garrick nearly got the equalizer at 86:08 as his flick over Hamilton's head hit the crossbar and came back down into play, but Tech couldn't put in the ensuing rebound.

For the game, Tech out-shot Howard, 18-4, and out-cornered the Bison, 14-0. Clemens led the Hokie offense with seven shots and his goal marked the second year in a row that he has scored Tech's first goal of the year. Kyle Renfro played all 90 minutes between the pipes for Tech.

Game #2 vs. Wisconsin | Sept. 2 | L, 1-0 (OT)

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team fell to Wisconsin, 1-0 in overtime, on day one of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Badgers' Josh Thiermann scored the game-winner in sudden death overtime in the 97th minute.

The start of the game was delayed by nearly two hours due to two lightning delays in the first match of the day between Cincinnati and Virginia. In the 20th minute, captain James Shupp came forward down the right side and put in a low cross which found Mike Wilkie who fired a shot just wide of the near post. In the first period, Tech held a 9-7 advantage in shots and recorded six corners to just two for Wisconsin.

Robert Alberti played well on the flank the entire night, serving in crosses and creating chances. He led Tech in shots for the game with five. Alberti nearly caught Wisconsin keeper Ciro Martinez off his line in the 64th minute when his shot hit from the left side hit the crossbar. Tech also outshot the Badgers, 11-6, in the second half, and had a 20-16 advantage on the game. However, neither team found the back of the net in regulation and the game was forced into a golden goal overtime period.

In the first extra session, Wisconsin's Thiermann found space down the left side and dribbled into the Tech box where his shot from $10\ yards$ found the back of the net.

Kyle Renfro played all 96:44 in goal and made seven saves. Wisconsin improved to 2-0-0, while the Hokies fell to 0-2-0.

Game #3 vs. Cincinnati | Sept. 4 | W, 2-1

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- Robert Alberti converted a penalty kick in the 82nd minute to give the Virginia Tech men's soccer its first win of the season over Cincinnati, 2-1, in the final game of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Hokies improved to 1-2-0 overall on the season while the Bearcats dropped to 1-2-0.

In the first half, Tech got on the board only 4:28 into the game as Ben Strong played a through ball to Mikey Minutillo who finished first time from 10 yards out on the right side of the box. The assist was Strong's first as a Hokie.

In the second half, the Bearcats' Emmanuel Appiah found space in the center of the park and fired a shot from 30 yards that hit the crossbar and went in to tie the match at 60:55. Then, with eight and a half minutes remaining, Michael Garrick was fouled after the play in the box by Cincinnati goalkeeper Joey Barnard. Barnard was assessed a yellow card and Tech was awarded a penalty kick.

Alberti stepped up and buried the penalty in the lower left corner after Barnard guessed the other direction to give the Hokies the win, 2-1. It was his first game-winning goal as a Hokie.

Kyle Renfro was solid all game as he made four saves, including a crucial stop in the 84th minute off a shot from Cincinnati's Leon Powell. For the match, Cincinnati outshot the Hokies, 13-7, while corners were even at six apiece. After the game, Jed Prater and Alberti were named to the all-tournament team for Tech.

Game #4 vs. #1 North Carolina | Sept. 10 | W, 1-0 (2 OT)

BLACKSBURG, Va. – James Shupp scored the game-winning goal in the 103rd minute and Kyle Renfro notched his second career shutout as the Virginia Tech men's soccer team defeated No.1-ranked North Carolina, 1-0 in double overtime, in the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both teams in front of a packed house at Thompson Field.

Eight minutes into the second half, UNC's Enzo Martinez ripped a shot from outside the box which hit the near post. The rebound came out the Tar Heels' Kirk Urso who followed with a low shot but Renfro made a fine recovering save to keep the game tied at 0-0. The game would remain tied after 90 minutes, forcing sudden death overtime.

The Hokies' then stunned the Tar Heels just 2:31 into the second overtime period with the only goal of the match. The goal originated with a long throw-in from the left side by Tech that was flicked on by Kevin Reitzel. The ball bounced in the box several times and eventually came through to an open Shupp on the back post who finished off the game-winner. It was Shupp's first goal since 2009 and his first game-winner as a Hokie. The assist was also Reitzel's first collegiate point.

The win was Tech's first over North Carolina since 2007. It was also the Hokies' first win over a top-ranked team since 2004 when Tech beat ACC rival Duke, 1-0, in Durham.
