### LAST TIME OUT ...

The Hokies won their third straight match as they defeated Longwood, 1-0, on Tuesday night at Thompson Field. After a slow start, Tech got the breakthrough early in the second half when Drew Ranahan headed home a Ben Strong corner kick just 67 seconds into the second period. It was Ranahan's first collegiate goal. The Hokies continued to put the pressure on Longwood as the Lancers cleared a couple of Hokie shots off the end line. Kevin Reitzel appeared to score the insurance goal for Tech in the 74th minute, but his header, which hit the crossbar and came straight down, was ruled by the referee to not have fully crossed the goal line. Kyle Renfro posted his second straight shutout and finished with four saves.

The Hokies continue a two-game road swing on Tuesday, Sept. 20 at East Tennessee State at 7:00 p.m. Tech then returns home on Saturday, Sept. 24 to play top-ranked Maryland at 7:00 p.m.

### SCOUTING #11 BOSTON COLLEGE...

- Boston College enters the game with a record of 4-1-0 overall and 0-1-0 in the ACC. The Eagles opened the season with four straight wins over George Mason, Fairfield, Quinnipiac, and Dartmouth, before falling in their ACC opener to Maryland, 4-0, on Saturday.

- In their last game, then-No.8 Boston College fell to then-No.2 Maryland, 4-0, in College Park, Md. The Terps scored three second half goals en route to the win. Justin Luthy had five saves in goal for BC.

- As a team, Boston College is outscoring their opponents, 12-7. Amit Aburmad leads the team in scoring with 11 points on four goals and three assists. Kyle Bekker and Charlie Rugg each have three goals and two assists for eight points. In goal, Justin Luthy has started all five games and played 443 minutes. He has 19 saves and a 1.42 goals against average.

### SERIES HISTORY...

- This is the 10th all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and Boston College in men's soccer.

- The Eagles hold a 7-1-1 series lead against the Hokies. Boston College has won six straight games over Tech, dating back to the 2006 season, including a win in the 2007 ACC Tournament. The last Hokie win over BC was in 2003, when then-No.16 ranked Tech beat the Eagles, 2-1 in double overtime, in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Hokies have a 1-3 record in games played on the road at BC. The first meeting was in 2001, when BC defeated Tech, 2-1, in Blacksburg.

- In last year's game, then-No.20 Boston College defeated Tech, 3-1, in Blacksburg on Nov. 5, 2010. The Eagles' Charlie Rugg opened the scoring in the second minute, but Tech's David Clemens answered in the 36th minute, making the score 1-1 at halftime. However, Boston College got goals at 55:58 and 58:34 from Kyle Bekker and Sacir Hot, respectively, to claim the win.

### CAPTAINS...

- This year's team captains are r-senior James Shupp and junior David Fiorello. It marks the second year in a row that Fiorello will wear the captain's armband for Tech.

### RENFRO RACKS UP HONORS...

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kyle Renfro was named the Virginia Tech Athletics Hardee's Star of the Week, the ACC Co-Men's Soccer Player of the Week and *Soccer America's* Men's Player of the Week for his performance against then-No.1 ranked North Carolina on Saturday. Renfro had a career-high nine saves and posted his second career shutout in the Hokies' 1-0 double overtime victory.

### GAME-WINNERS...

- Junior midfielder Robert Alberti, James Shupp and redshirt freshman defender Drew Ranahan each scored their first game-winner as a Hokie during the past three games. Alberti scored on a penalty kick against Cincinnati on Sept. 4, while Shupp tallied the game-winner against then-No.1 ranked North Carolina on Saturday in the second overtime period. Ranahan's 47th minute header on Tuesday against Longwood was his first collegiate goal.

### TEAMMATES...

- Freshmen Hunter Byrnes and Drew Hartell were high school teammates at F.W. Cox High School in Virginia Beach. They also both played club soccer for Beach FC, the same club that r-junior Jeremy Williams played for in his prep days.

- Freshmen Zach Hoover and Kevin Reitzel and sophomore Nick Smirniotopoulos all played club soccer for McLean Academy in Virginia.

- Drew Ranahan, sophomore Devante Dubose and junior Michael Garrick all played high school soccer at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif. Dubose and Garrick were also members of the Mustang Soccer Academy for club soccer.

### HOKIES BY STATE...

- The Hokies represent 10 states and one country outside the United States. Virginia leads the way with 11 players, followed by California (5), Pennsylvania (3), New Jersey (2), New York (2), Florida (1), Kansas (1), Georgia (1), Iowa (1), Texas (1) and Australia (1).

Mike Brizendine enters his third year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2010 squad played five top-20 nationally ranked opponents, including taking sixth-ranked Virginia to overtime on the road. His 2009-10 team was one of only three Atlantic Coast Conference men's soccer programs to receive the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. It marked the second time in program history and first since 2003, that the Hokies earned academic recognition from the NSCAA.



An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned all-conference and all-region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.

## Game-by-Game Recap

### Game #1 vs. Howard | August 27 | L, 2-1

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team opened the 2011 season on Aug. 27 with a 2-1 loss to Howard at Thompson Field.

After a scoreless first half, in which Tech held a majority of the possession in the Howard half of the field, the Bison stunned the Hokies as they got on the board first when Mario Martin capitalized with a low finish from eight yards on a pass from Rahman Alarape at 59:02.

Then at 80:12, Martin again finished for Howard, this time off a pass from Akinbola Richardson, making the score 2-0 in favor of the Bison. However, Tech would get the board just 15 seconds later when Michael Garrick found David Clemens, who dribbled past Howard defenders into the box and finished off a nice individual effort from just outside the six-yard box. After their goal, the Hokies kept on pushing numbers forward as Howard tried to hold on. Garrick nearly got the equalizer at 86:08 as his flick over Hamilton's head hit the crossbar and came back down into play, but Tech couldn't put in the ensuing rebound.

For the game, Tech out-shot Howard, 18-4, and out-cornered the Bison, 14-0. Clemens led the Hokie offense with seven shots and his goal marked the second year in a row that he has scored Tech's first goal of the year. Kyle Renfro played all 90 minutes between the pipes for Tech.

### Game #2 vs. Wisconsin | Sept. 2 | L, 1-0 (OT)

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team fell to Wisconsin, 1-0 in overtime, on day one of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Badgers' Josh Thiermann scored the game-winner in sudden death overtime in the 97th minute.

The start of the game was delayed by nearly two hours due to two lightning delays in the first match of the day between Cincinnati and Virginia. In the 20th minute, captain James Shupp came forward down the right side and put in a low cross which found Mike Wilkie who fired a shot just wide of the near post. In the first period, Tech held a 9-7 advantage in shots and recorded six corners to just two for Wisconsin.

Robert Alberti played well on the flank the entire night, serving in crosses and creating chances. He led Tech in shots for the game with five. Alberti nearly caught Wisconsin keeper Ciro Martinez off his line in the 64th minute when his shot hit from the left side hit the crossbar. Tech also outshot the Badgers, 11-6, in the second half, and had a 20-16 advantage on the game. However, neither team found the back of the net in regulation and the game was forced into a golden goal overtime period.

In the first extra session, Wisconsin's Thiermann found space down the left side and dribbled into the Tech box where his shot from 10 yards found the back of the net.

Kyle Renfro played all 96:44 in goal and made seven saves.

### Game #3 vs. Cincinnati | Sept. 4 | W, 2-1

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- Robert Alberti converted a penalty kick in the 82nd minute to give the Virginia Tech men's soccer its first win of the season over Cincinnati, 2-1, in the final game of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Hokies improved to 1-2-0 overall on the season while the Bearcats dropped to 1-2-0.

In the first half, Tech got on the board only 4:28 into the game as Ben Strong played a through ball to Mikey Minuttillo who finished first time from 10 yards out on the right side of the box. The assist was Strong's first as a Hokie.

In the second half, the Bearcats' Emmanuel Appiah found space in the center of the park and fired a shot from 30 yards that hit the crossbar and went in to tie the match at 60:55. Then, with eight and a half minutes remaining, Michael Garrick was fouled after the play in the box by Cincinnati goalkeeper Joey Barnard. Barnard was assessed a yellow card and Tech was awarded a penalty kick.

Alberti stepped up and buried the penalty in the lower left corner after Barnard guessed the other direction to give the Hokies the win, 2-1. It was his first game-winning goal as a Hokie.

Kyle Renfro was solid all game as he made four saves, including a crucial stop in the 84th minute off a shot from Cincinnati's Leon Powell. For the match, Cincinnati outshot the Hokies, 13-7, while corners were even at six apiece. After the game, Jed Prater and Alberti were named to the all-tournament team for Tech.

### Game #4 vs. #1 North Carolina | Sept. 10 | W, 1-0 (2 OT)

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- James Shupp scored the game-winning goal in the 103rd minute and Kyle Renfro notched his second career shutout as the Virginia Tech men's soccer team defeated No.1-ranked North Carolina, 1-0 in double overtime, in the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both teams in front of a packed house at Thompson Field.

Eight minutes into the second half, UNC's Enzo Martinez ripped a shot from outside the box which hit the near post. The rebound came out the Tar Heels' Kirk Urso who followed with a low shot but Renfro made a fine recovering save to keep the game tied at 0-0. The game would remain tied after 90 minutes, forcing sudden death overtime.

The Hokies' then stunned the Tar Heels just 2:31 into the second overtime period with the only goal of the match. The goal originated with a long throw-in from the left side by Tech that was flicked on by Kevin Reitzel. The ball bounced in the box several times and eventually came through to an open Shupp on the back post who finished off the game-winner. It was Shupp's first goal since 2009 and his first game-winner as a Hokie. The assist was also Reitzel's first collegiate point.

The win was Tech's first over North Carolina since 2007. It was also the Hokies' first win over a top-ranked team since 2004 when Tech beat ACC rival Duke, 1-0, in Durham.

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team won its third straight game as the Hokies defeated Longwood, 1-0, at Thompson Field. Drew Ranahan scored the game-winner in the 47th minute with a header from a corner kick by Ben Strong.

In the first half the Hokies came out of the gates a little slow as Longwood outshot Tech, 6-3, in the first period. The match would prove to a physical battle all night long as the two teams each racked up 18 fouls and two yellow cards.

Just one minute and seven seconds into the second half, Tech got the breakthrough. Strong struck a low corner to the near post which Ranahan redirected off his head low into the far post from six yards for his first collegiate goal. The assist was Strong's second of the season.

The Hokie defense and goalkeeper Kyle Renfro, this week's ACC Men's Soccer Co-Player of the Week, tallied their second straight shutout.

Longwood and Tech each finished with 14 shots on the night, while the Lancers held a 5-3 advantage in corners. Renfro played all 90 minutes in goal for Tech and finished with four saves, lowering his season goals against average to 0.77.

The Hokies three-game winning streak is their first since the 2007 season, when they won 14 matches and advanced to the College Cup. In addition, the last time Tech posted back-to-back shutouts was in the 2007 NCAA Tournament.
