### LAST TIME OUT ...

The Hokies traveled to the nation's capital on Tuesday, but host American University held off Tech, 1-0. The Eagles' Alassane Kane scored the game's only goal in the 31st minute on a deflected shot. Colin Seigfried had the assist. The Hokies dominated play in the second period, out-shooting the Eagles, 11-2, and out-cornering them, 3-0, but could not find the equalizer. Kevin Reitzel hit the post with a header in the 59th minute for Tech. Kyle Renfro posted three saves in goal for the Hokies, while Will Witherspoon led the Tech offense with three shots. Five other Hokies recorded two shots.

### NEXT UP ...

Following a week break from games, the Hokies wrap up a three-game road swing as they travel to Newark, N.J. to play New Jersey Institute of Technology on Oct. 8 at 7 p.m. Tech then returns home to Thompson Field on Oct. 11 for a 7 p.m. game against Campbell.

### SCOUTING WAKE FOREST..

- Wake Forest enters the game with a record of 4-4-1 overall and 1-2-0 in the ACC. The Demon Deacons opened the season 0-2-1, but are 4-2 in their last six outings, earning wins over ACC foe Clemson (2-1), Cleveland State (2-1), Winthrop (1-0) and Davidson (4-1).

- In its last game on Wednesday, Wake Forest defeated Davidson, 4-1, at Spry Stadium. After a scoreless first half, the Deacs exploded for four unanswered second-half goals. The four goals were a season-high for Wake. Ben Newman, Luca Gimenez, Andy Lubahn and Danny Wenzel scored with Lubahn adding two assists. Michael Lisch had three saves in goal.

- As a team, Wake Forest is being outscored by its opponents, 12-10. Newman has a team-high three goals and an assist for seven points while Lubahn (two goals, three assists) matches Newman for the team lead in scoring. Teddy Mullin also has three assists and Gimenez adds two goals and an assist. Lisch has started all nine games in goal and has 35 saves, a 1.32 goals against average and two shutouts.

### SERIES HISTORY...

- This is the 18th all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and Wake Forest in men's soccer.

- Wake Forest holds a 13-2-2 advantage over Tech in the all-time series, including wins in the last four meetings and a 10-0-1 mark in the last 11 meetings. On Oct. 5, 2007, the two teams tied, 3-3, in double overtime, as Wake Forest was ranked number one at the time and Tech was ranked ninth. The last Virginia Tech win was in 1997, when Hokies won, 2-0, in Blacksburg. Virginia Tech is 1-6 all-time when playing Wake Forest on the road, with the lone win coming in 1982. The series began in 1980.

- In last year's game, Wake Forest earned a 2-0 win over the Hokies on Oct. 1, 2010 at Spry Stadium. Sam Redmond scored only 48 seconds into the match off a pass from Tolani Ibikunle. The Deacs held the 1-0 lead until the 81st minute when Kyle Emerson scored the insurance goal. Wake out shot Tech, 17-9, and out cornered the Hokies, 12-6.

### CAPTAINS...

• This year's team captains are redshirt-senior James Shupp and junior David Fiorello. It marks the second year in a row that Fiorello is wearing the captain's armband for Tech.

### HOKIES AMONG CONFERENCE LEADERS...

• Sophomore goalkeeper Kyle Renfro ranks among the ACC leaders in several statistical categories. Renfro leads the league in total saves (44) and saves in ACC matches (22). He is also second in overall saves per game (4.89) and save percentage (.786).

• As a team, the Hokies lead the ACC in saves (46). They are also tied for second in corner kicks taken (64) and corners per game (7.11).

### GAME-WINNERS...

• Junior Robert Alberti, James Shupp and redshirt-freshman Drew Ranahan each scored their first game-winner as a Hokie during Tech's three wins this season. Alberti scored on a penalty kick against Cincinnati on Sept. 4, while Shupp tallied the game-winner against then-No.1 ranked North Carolina on Sept. 10 in the second overtime period. Ranahan's 47th minute header on Sept. 13 against Longwood was his first collegiate goal.

### TEAMMATES...

• Freshmen Hunter Byrnes and Drew Hartell were high school teammates at F.W. Cox High School in Virginia Beach. They also both played club soccer for Beach FC, the same club that redshirt junior Jeremy Williams played for in his prep days.

• Freshmen Zach Hoover and Kevin Reitzel and sophomore Nick Smirniotopoulos all played club soccer for McLean Academy in Northern Virginia.

• Drew Ranahan, sophomore Devante Dubose and junior Michael Garrick all played high school soccer at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif. Dubose and Garrick were also members of the Mustang Soccer Academy for club soccer.

### HOKIES BY STATE...

• The Hokies represent nine states and one country outside the United States. Virginia leads the way with 11 players, followed by California (5), Pennsylvania (3), New Jersey (2), New York (2), Florida (1), Kansas (1), Iowa (1), Texas (1) and Australia (1).

### ACC AMONG NATION'S BEST...

• The Atlantic Coast Conference has traditionally been one of the nation's strongest conferences in men's soccer. 2011 is no different as three teams are currently ranked in the top-15 by *College Soccer News*. Mike Brizendine enters his third year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2010 squad played five top-20 nationally ranked opponents, including taking sixth-ranked Virginia to overtime on the road. His 2009-10 team was one of only three Atlantic Coast Conference men's soccer programs to receive the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. It marked the second time in program history and first since 2003, that the Hokies earned academic recognition from the NSCAA.



An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned all-conference and all-region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.

## Game-by-Game Recap

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team opened the 2011 season on Aug. 27 with a 2-1 loss to Howard at Thompson Field.

After a scoreless first half, in which Tech held a majority of the possession in the Howard half of the field, the Bison stunned the Hokies as they got on the board first when Mario Martin capitalized with a low finish from eight yards on a pass from Rahman Alarape at 59:02.

Then at 80:12, Martin again finished for Howard, this time off a pass from Akinbola Richardson, making the score 2-0 in favor of the Bison. However, Tech would get the board just 15 seconds later when Michael Garrick found David Clemens, who dribbled past Howard defenders into the box and finished off a nice individual effort from just outside the six-yard box. After their goal, the Hokies kept on pushing numbers forward as Howard tried to hold on. Garrick nearly got the equalizer at 86:08 as his flick over Hamilton's head hit the crossbar and came back down into play, but Tech couldn't put in the ensuing rebound.

For the game, Tech out-shot Howard, 18-4, and out-cornered the Bison, 14-0. Clemens led the Hokie offense with seven shots and his goal marked the second year in a row that he has scored Tech's first goal of the year. Kyle Renfro played all 90 minutes between the pipes for Tech.

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team fell to Wisconsin, 1-0 in overtime, on day one of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Badgers' Josh Thiermann scored the game-winner in sudden death overtime in the 97th minute.

The start of the game was delayed by nearly two hours due to two lightning delays in the first match of the day between Cincinnati and Virginia. In the 20th minute, captain James Shupp came forward down the right side and put in a low cross which found Mike Wilkie who fired a shot just wide of the near post. In the first period, Tech held a 9-7 advantage in shots and recorded six corners to just two for Wisconsin.

Robert Alberti played well on the flank the entire night, serving in crosses and creating chances. He led Tech in shots for the game with five. Alberti nearly caught Wisconsin keeper Ciro Martinez off his line in the 64th minute when his shot hit from the left side hit the crossbar. Tech also outshot the Badgers, 11-6, in the second half, and had a 20-16 advantage on the game. However, neither team found the back of the net in regulation and the game was forced into a golden goal overtime period.

In the first extra session, Wisconsin's Thiermann found space down the left side and dribbled into the Tech box where his shot from 10 yards found the back of the net.

The Hokies improved to 1-2-0 overall on the season while the Bearcats dropped to 1-2-0.

In the first half, Tech got on the board only 4:28 into the game as Ben Strong played a through ball to Mikey Minuttillo who finished first time from 10 yards out on the right side of the box. The assist was Strong's first as a Hokie.

In the second half, the Bearcats' Emmanuel Appiah found space in the center of the park and fired a shot from 30 yards that hit the crossbar and went in to tie the match at 60:55. Then, with eight and a half minutes remaining, Michael Garrick was fouled after the play in the box by Cincinnati goalkeeper Joey Barnard. Barnard was assessed a yellow card and Tech was awarded a penalty kick.

Alberti stepped up and buried the penalty in the lower left corner after Barnard guessed the other direction to give the Hokies the win, 2-1. It was his first game-winning goal as a Hokie.

Kyle Renfro was solid all game as he made four saves, including a crucial stop in the 84th minute off a shot from Cincinnati's Leon Powell. For the match, Cincinnati outshot the Hokies, 13-7, while corners were even at six apiece. After the game, Jed Prater and Alberti were named to the all-tournament team for Tech.

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** -- James Shupp scored the game-winning goal in the 103rd minute and Kyle Renfro notched his second career shutout as the Virginia Tech men's soccer team defeated No.1-ranked North Carolina, 1-0 in double overtime, in the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both teams in front of a packed house at Thompson Field.

Eight minutes into the second half, UNC's Enzo Martinez ripped a shot from outside the box which hit the near post. The rebound came out the Tar Heels' Kirk Urso who followed with a low shot but Renfro made a fine recovering save to keep the game tied at 0-0. The game would remain tied after 90 minutes, forcing sudden death overtime.

The Hokies' then stunned the Tar Heels just 2:31 into the second overtime period with the only goal of the match. The goal originated with a long throw-in from the left side by Tech that was flicked on by Kevin Reitzel. The ball bounced in the box several times and eventually came through to an open Shupp on the back post who finished off the game-winner. It was Shupp's first goal since 2009 and his first game-winner as a Hokie. The assist was also Reitzel's first collegiate point.

The win was Tech's first over North Carolina since 2007. It was also the Hokies' first win over a top-ranked team since 2004 when Tech beat ACC rival Duke, 1-0, in Durham.
