LAST TIME OUT ...

The Hokies fell, 1-0, in double overtime at Wake Forest in an Atlantic Coast Conference match on Saturday at Spry Stadium. The Demon Deacons scored the game-winner with just 18 seconds remaining in the second overtime period. Sophomore goalkeeper Kyle Renfro was solid in goal, as he posted seven saves. The Hokies' Beto Velazquez, Will Witherspoon and Mikey Minuttillo all recorded shots, with rookie Witherspoon putting one on frame. The Deacs netted the game-winner at the 109:42 mark when Jared Watts headed in a free kick off assists from Ben Newnam and Tolani Ibikunle.

Tech returns home to Thompson Field for the first time in over two weeks on Tuesday, Oct. 11 for a 7 p.m. game against Campbell. The Hokies then travel to Raleigh, N.C. for an ACC match at North Carolina State on Friday, Oct. 14 at 7 p.m.

SCOUTING NJIT...

- New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) enters the game with a record of 2-7-2 overall. The Highlanders have earned wins at VMI, 3-2, on Sept. 4, and Quinnipiac, 2-1, in overtime on Sunday. They have also earned scoreless home draws against Long Island and Drexel. NJIT competes in the Atlantic Soccer Conference (ASC) in men's soccer and the Great West Conference in other sports. They have yet to play a conference match this season.

- In its last game on Sunday, NJIT defeated Quinnipiac, 2-1, in overtime. The win snapped a three-game losing streak for the Highlanders. Christian Galindo scored the game-winner in the 93rd minute, unassisted. Nathan D'Aversa also scored for NJIT in the ninth minute via an assist from Angel Gomez. NJIT won the shot battle, 22-6. The match saw eight cards issued, including two red cards for Quinnipiac. Lars Maalen-Johansen had three saves in goal for NJIT.

- As a team, NJIT is being outscored by its opponents, 19-9. Franco Gamero leads the team in scoring with three goals for six points. Galindo adds two goals and an assist for five points. Maalen-Johansen has started six games in goal, while Adriano Deabreu has started five.

SERIES HISTORY...

- This is the first ever meeting in men's soccer between Virginia Tech and NJIT. Later this month, Tech will also take on Campbell (Oct. 11) and Wright State (Oct. 18) for the first time in men's soccer.

- The Hokies have a 5-5-1 all-time record against current members of the Atlantic Soccer Conference, which includes NJIT, Longwood, Houston Baptist, Adelphi and Howard. Earlier this season, Tech fell to Howard, 2-1, in the season-opener in Blacksburg on Aug. 27. However, the Hokies defeated Longwood, 1-0, on Sept. 13.

- Against the other members of the ASC, Virginia Tech has played Longwood the most times in its history (eight) and is 3-4-1 against the Lancers. Tech is also 1-1-0 against Howard, 1-0-0 against Adelphi and has yet to play Houston Baptist in men's soccer.

CAPTAINS...

- This year's team captains are redshirt senior James Shupp and junior David Fiorello. It marks the second year in a row that Fiorello is wearing the captain's armband for Tech.

RENFRO AMONG CONFERENCE LEADERS...

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kyle Renfro ranks among the ACC leaders in several statistical categories. The Forest, Va., native leads the league in total saves (51), saves per game (5.10) and save percentage (.797).
- In ACC matches, Renfro also leads the league with 29 saves in four matches, for a league-best 7.25 saves per game.

GAME-WINNERS...

- Junior Robert Alberti, James Shupp and redshirt freshman Drew Ranahan each scored their first game-winner as a Hokie during Tech's three wins this season. Alberti scored on a penalty kick against Cincinnati on Sept. 4, while Shupp tallied the game-winner against then-No.1 ranked North Carolina on Sept. 10 in the second overtime period. Ranahan's 47th minute header on Sept. 13 against Longwood was his first collegiate goal.

TEAMMATES...

- Freshmen Hunter Byrnes and Drew Hartell were high school teammates at F.W. Cox High School in Virginia Beach. They also both played club soccer for Beach FC, the same club that redshirt junior Jeremy Williams played for in his prep days.
- Freshmen Zach Hoover and Kevin Reitzel and sophomore Nick Smirniotopoulos all played club soccer for McLean Academy in Northern Virginia.
- Drew Ranahan, sophomore Devante Dubose and junior Michael Garrick all played high school soccer at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif. Dubose and Garrick were also members of the Mustang Soccer Academy for club soccer.

HOKIES BY STATE...

- The Hokies represent nine states and one country outside the United States. Virginia leads the way with 11 players, followed by California (5), Pennsylvania (3), New Jersey (2), New York (2), Florida (1), Kansas (1), Iowa (1), Texas (1) and Australia (1).

ACC AMONG NATION'S BEST...

- The Atlantic Coast Conference has traditionally been one of the nation's strongest conferences in men's soccer. 2011 is no different as four teams are currently ranked in the top-25 by *Soccer America*. Mike Brizendine enters his third year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2010 squad played five top-20 nationally ranked opponents, including taking sixth-ranked Virginia to overtime on the road. His 2009-10 team was one of only three Atlantic Coast Conference men's soccer programs to receive the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. It marked the second time in program history and first since 2003, that the Hokies earned academic recognition from the NSCAA.



An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned all-conference and all-region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team opened the 2011 season on Aug. 27 with a 2-1 loss to Howard at Thompson Field.

After a scoreless first half, in which Tech held a majority of the possession in the Howard half of the field, the Bison stunned the Hokies as they got on the board first when Mario Martin capitalized with a low finish from eight yards on a pass from Rahman Alarape at 59:02.

Then at 80:12, Martin again finished for Howard, this time off a pass from Akinbola Richardson, making the score 2-0 in favor of the Bison. However, Tech would get the board just 15 seconds later when Michael Garrick found David Clemens, who dribbled past Howard defenders into the box and finished off a nice individual effort from just outside the six-yard box. Garrick nearly got the equalizer at 86:08 as his flick over Hamilton's head hit the crossbar and came back down into play, but Tech couldn't put in the ensuing rebound.

For the game, Tech out-shot Howard, 18-4, and out-cornered the Bison, 14-0. Clemens led the Hokie offense with seven shots and his goal marked the second year in a row that he has scored Tech's first goal of the year. Kyle Renfro played all 90 minutes between the pipes for Tech.

Barnard was assessed a yellow card and Tech was awarded a penalty kick.

Alberti stepped up and buried the penalty in the lower left corner after Barnard guessed the other direction to give the Hokies the win, 2-1. It was his first game-winning goal as a Hokie.

Kyle Renfro was solid all game as he made four saves, including a crucial stop in the 84th minute off a shot from Cincinnati's Leon Powell. For the match, Cincinnati outshot the Hokies, 13-7, while corners were even at six apiece. After the game, Jed Prater and Alberti were named to the all-tournament team for Tech.

The rebound came out the Tar Heels' Kirk Urso who followed with a low shot but Renfro made a fine recovering save to keep the game tied at 0-0. The game would remain tied after 90 minutes, forcing sudden death overtime.
